

- dling. (PNP *kakaa*.) 2. nvs. 'A'ā lava; stony, abounding with 'a'ā lava. 3. (Cap.) n. Sirius, a zenith star that passes over Tahiti and Ra'i-ātea, formerly believed used by navigators; one of the brightest stars in the heavens. See *Sirius* for var. names. 4. n. Young stage of damselfish ('ālo'ilo'i). Also 'ā.
- 'ā.ā. 1. nvs. Dumbness, inability to speak intelligibly, a dumb person (Puk. 4.11); dumb, silent, still; to stutter and stammer, as a dumb person. *Po'e kuli a 'ā'ā*, deaf mutes. *Ua 'ā'ā ka leo*, the voice is unintelligible. *He 'ā'ā kō ka hale*, the people of the house are silent. *I lohe 'ia e nā 'ā'ā lololohe; i mau 'ā'ā lōlōkuli*, it was heard from the dumb one who could hear, about those who were deaf and dumb. 2. nvs. Dwarf, small person; dwarfish, small. *Kanaka poupu 'ā'ā*, a short stout person. *He 'Ilio 'ā'ā* (KL line 577), a short-legged dog. 3. vs. Demented, panic-stricken. See 'ā'ā maka, 'ā'aia. *Holo 'ā'ā*, to run about in a panic. hō.'ā.'ā. To look about or search in confusion, stray, wander; disconcerted. *E hō'ā'ā ana i nā makaaniani*, looking in confusion for the spectacles. 4. Probable var. of 'ā 4, booby bird. 5. n. Male 'ō'ō bird. (PPN *ka(a)kaa*.)
- 'ā'ā. n. Network of veins.
- 'ā'ā'a. nvs. Clothlike sheath at base of coconut frond; vascular bundles in taro corm, chaff, tissue; fibrous, stringy. Also hā'a'a.
- 'ā'ā.ā. 1. Redup. of 'ā'ā 1; lava cave. 2. Redup. of 'ā'ā 1.
- 'ā'ā.'ā'ā. Redup. of 'ā'ā'a. 'A'ā'ā'a ho'i kēia 'uala, this sweet potato is full of fibers.
- 'ā'āhi. n. Scion or shoot of sandalwood.
- 'ā'ā.ahi. n. Bag for carrying fire-making equipment ('ā'a, bag, and *ahi*, fire).
- 'ā'ā.'aki. Redup. of 'ā'aki.
- 'ā'āe. n. Second or third crop, as of taro; taro patch where the taro has been pulled up. Also 'ae.
- 'ā'ā.ea. interj. The sound *ay* that infants make in calling for attention; to make this sound.
- 'ā'āha. n. Netted carrier for a calabash, made of sennit or *olonā* cord. More commonly called *kōkō*. Cf. 'āha, sennit.
- 'ā'āhi. Same as 'iliahi, sandalwood. (And.)
- 'ā'āhi. n. Burning fire. hō'ā'āhi. To set on fire.
- 'ā'ā.hia. Pas/imp. of 'ā'ā 2.
- 'ā'āho. 1. n. Thatch purlin; rails, as in a fence. See 'āho-hui, 'āhōpi'o, 'āhōpueo. *Pā 'ā'āho*, corral, rail fence. 2. nvt. Container, as for *pia*, arrowroot starch; to put *pia* in small packages so that it may keep sweet. *Rare*.
- 'ā'āho.kau. Same as *haupia*, coconut and arrowroot pudding.
- 'ā'āhu. nvt. Clothing in general, garment, array, attire, costume, mantle, gown; to put on or wear clothing, especially shirt, suit, or coat; to cover or wrap, as the body with a blanket. *E 'ā'āhu aku 'oe i kēia*, wear this. 'A'āhu ho'ohiwahiwa, festive attire, evening gown. 'A'āhu i kau lula 'ia, formal attire. 'A'āhu au i ka pono, I have clothed myself in righteousness. hō.'ā'āhu. To put clothing on someone else; to dress, supply with clothing, clothe.
- 'ā'ā.hua. Pas/imp. of 'ā'āhu.
- 'ā'ā.huā, 'ā'āhuwā. nvi. To speak reproachfully, contemptuously, deride, jeer; jealous challenge. (Gram. 6.5.) 'A'āhuā noho'i kāna mau 'ōlelo, his words are contemptuous.
- 'ā'āhu alii. n. Regal attire, a royal robe, a type of colored tapa worn by people of rank.
- 'ā.ā.hua.ii. n. A fabulous being said to have had extraordinary strength, to have come from the center of the earth, and to have been the creator of all dwarfs. Cf. *ha'akualiki*.
- 'ā'āhu a po'o. n. Head shield; protection for the head in war, as helmet, shield. (Epeso 6.16.)
- 'ā'ā.hu'i. n. Aching veins, varicose veins.
- 'ā'āhu.kau. n. Armor, war garment.
- 'ā'ā.huki. n. Tendon. *Lit.*, pulled vein. See ex., *wikani*.
- 'ā'āhu.maka.loa. n. A long *malo* or ornamented band made of the soft *makaloa* rush; to put on or wear this garment.
- 'ā'āhu'oi.hana.piha. n. Full regalia, dress uniform. *Lit.*, full professional garment.
- 'ā'āhu.pā.wehe. n. Garment made of *pāwehe*, patterned mat; mat made of soft material and woven in the *pāwehe* pattern; to put on and wear this garment. *No laila i 'ōlelo 'ia ai he 'ā'āhu pāwehe hiwa na ka makani*, so it was called the choice patterned mat made by the spirits.
- 'ā'āhu'ula. Var. of 'āhu'ula.
- 'ā'ā.huwā. Var. spelling of 'ā'āhuā.
- 'ā'āi. 1. Redup. of 'āi 1; eating, spreading, festering, increasing, as a sore; ulcerous, cancerous, malignant; to eat away, corrode; to take bait readily, as fish; erosion. See 'ā'āiole. *He ma'i 'ā'āi*, a spreading sore, infection, or cancer. 'A'āi ka hīnālea i ka 'ōpae, the *hīnālea* fish takes the shrimp [bait] readily. *Nā mana'o 'ā'āi 'awa kani'uhū*, heartbreaking, sad thoughts. 2. vs. Bright, vivid, as of contrasting colors. 'A'āi ka lei hulu mele-mele i ka holokū 'ele'ele, a yellow feather lei appears brighter on a black Mother Hubbard. 3. Same as 'ā'ei, a net.
- 'ā'āia. vs. Demented. 'O Moikeha, mai Kahiki ka hele 'ana mai, i 'ā'āia i ke aloha o Lu'ukia (For. 4:161), Moikeha was from Kahiki, where he was mad with love for Lu'ukia.
- 'ā'āia. n. Legendary bird believed to have taken the shape of the 'ā, booby bird. See 'ā 4.
- 'ā'āi-anuhe-a-Kāne. n. Legendary bird. *Lit.*, caterpillar eater of Kāne. See 'ā 4.
- 'ā'ā.ina. Redup. of 'ā'ina.
- 'ā'āi.ole. nvs. Inferior, weak, said of breadfruit or fruit with a weak stem that may fall before maturity; weak object. (Kep. 93.) *Fig.*, of persons dying before their time. *Mai lou i ka 'ulu i luna loa, o lou hewa i ka 'ā'āiole, eia nō ka 'ulu i ke alo*, don't pluck the breadfruit on top or you will pluck one not securely fastened, there is the breadfruit in front.
- 'ā'āaka. 1. vs. Surly, cranky, roiled, complaining, irritable, peevish, bad tempered, cantankerous, cross; severe, as labor. See ex., *papaioa. Kai 'ā'āaka* (Kep. 103), roiled sea. hō.'ā'āaka. To act surly, to pretend to be cross. 2. vs. Dry, as coral of the reef at low tide; parched, wrinkled, dry and thirsty; peeling off, as the tough skin of such fish as the *humuhumu* after it has been in the fire; to crackle, burst, as a ripe melon. 3. n. Rocky undersea cavern, (PH 219, Malo 26.) 4. n. Wood of the *naio*, bastard sandalwood.
- 'ā'āaki. Redup. of 'āki 1; to nip repeatedly; to take a nip and hold on (cf. *nahu*, to bite with the whole mouth, and *nau*, to chew); a bite, nibble. *Fig.*, thick, obscure, dark, penetrating; to feel pangs, as of love or childbirth. *Ka naho manini nui, ke 'ā'āki nei i ka limu*, the cleft with the large *manini* fish, nibbling now at the seaweed. 'A'āki ke ku'i, to close the mouth so tightly that the molars cling, as in lockjaw. *Ua 'ā'āki pa'a 'ia ke aloha wela i luna o Ka-'ōnohi-o-ka-lā* (Laie 595), hot love was firmly clutched upon Ka-'ōnohi-o-ka-lā. *Ke 'ā'āki nei ka pō 'ele'ele*, all-engulfing utter blackness of night. (PNP *kakati*.)
- 'ā'āaki.makau. n. A hook nibbler, said of small fish that nibble away the bait; to nibble at a hook.
- 'ā'āako. Redup. of 'āko 1, 2; repeated plucking; insatiable lust; to get into action (*rare*). 'A'āko aku i ka hana, get going with the work.
- 'ā'ā.koko. n. Vein, blood vessel.
- 'ā'ā.kolo. n. A root running horizontally that produces roots below and above; a rhizome, creeping root.
- 'ā'ā.kū. n. Name of a combination of diseases: liver complication resulting in hardening of the veins, bloody dysentery accompanied by fever.
- 'ā'ā.kū.kū.kū. n. Varicose veins. *Lit.*, raised veins.
- 'ā'āala. 1. nvs. Fragrant, sweet-smelling; fragrance, per-
