

- ahe**. nvi. Breeze; to blow or breathe gently, waft; softly blowing. *Ke ahe makani Pu'u-lena*, the gently wafting Pu'u-lena breeze.
- ā.hē**. vi., interj. To exclaim, to oh and ah; yes, so that's it, so, oh. *Āhē, pēlā kou mana'o, 'eā?* So that's your opinion, is it [in indignation]? *'Oia ka malama a ka po'e mahi 'ai e āhē ai i ka ulu maika'i a nā mea kanu* (Kep. 91), this is the month the farmers exclaim about the fine growth of the crops.
- 'ahē**. nvi. A hacking cough; to cough. Also *'ehē*. Cf. *'ahē'ahē, 'ehē'ehē*.
- 'ā.hē**. 1. vs. Timid, shy, wary. 2. n. Wild taro. *Kaua'i*. Varieties are qualified by the colors *ke'oke'o* and *'ula'ula*. Called *'āweu* on Hawai'i.
- ā.heā**. 1. Pas/imp. of *ahe*. *Lohe lau āheā*, hearing of the many breezes [rumor]. 2. inter. When (future). (Gram. 11.2.) (PPN *'afea*, PNP *aafea*.)
- 'ahēā**. Same as *'āheāheā* 2.
- ahe.ahē**. Redup. of *ahe*; soft, gentle in sound; weak. *Pā mai ka makani aheāhe*, the gentle wind blows. *He kamumu o ke aheāhe mālie*, rustle of the gentle breeze, sound of quiet whispers. *Aheāhe kahi 'ōpū i ka pōloli*, the stomach feels weak with hunger.
- 'ahē.'ahē**. Redup. of *'ahē*. *I ka manawa 'ahē'ahē, kau maila ka 'ahē'ahē make maluna o lāua*, at the time of coughing, a deadly coughing seized upon the two of them.
- 'ā.heā.heā**. 1. vi. To wilt, as a plant; warm, insipid. 2. n. A native shrub (*Chenopodium oahuense*) and an introduced weedy herb (*C. album*), both with narrow to triangular or rhomboidal, thickish leaves; flowers small, in panicles. Young plants, leaves, and plant tips are used for greens, wrapped in ti leaves and cooked on hot coals. Also *'ahea, 'āhewahewa, alaweo; alaweo huna* (Ni'ihau), *'āweoweo*. (Neal 331.) 3. Var. name for *pakai* 2. 4. Same as *heāheā*, to call.
- 'ahelē**. nvt. Snare; to snare. Also *pahelē*. *'Ahele pulu niu*, snare of coconut fibers, as for *'a'ama*, a crab.
- 'ā.hewa**. 1. nvi. To condemn, blame, censure, reproach, convict; condemnation, blame, conviction. *Mamuli o kona 'āhewa 'ia 'ana ua hopu hou 'ia*, after his conviction [he] was rearrested. **ho.'ā.hewa**. To find guilty, blame, condemn, pronounce guilty, convict, curse (Gal. 3.13). *Ho'āhewa kumu 'ole*, to bring false accusation. 2. vs. Walleyed, cross-eyed (with *maka*). 3. n. O'ahu name for the *mānā* fern. 4. A mimosa tree. (AP.)
- 'ā.hewa.hewa**. Same as *'āheāheā* 2, a shrub.
- ahi**. nvs. Fire, match, lightning; to burn in a fire, destroy by fire. See *ahikao, ahikoe, ahi koli, ahimakani, ipo, limu ahi, pau ahi*. *Leho ahi*, a cowry shell used for octopus fishing, colored red by toasting over fire. *Ahi wela*, hot fire, love hot as fire. *Hō'ā ahi*, to light a fire. *Ipo ahi*, fiery, ardent lover. *Ke ahi o Ka-maile*, the famous firebrands thrown over cliffs at Ka-maile, Kaua'i. *Ho'opau ahi, kinai ahi*, to put out a fire. *Ahi 'auhau*, firebrand. (PPN *afi*.)
- 'ahi**. n. Hawaiian tuna fishes, especially the yellow-fin tuna (*Thunnus albacares*), an important fish in the Honolulu market. The name *'ahi* may be qualified by the terms *hi'u wīwī* (thin tail) or *ka'aka'alā'au, kaha uli* (dark stripe), *kananā* (young stage, *lit.*, the defiant one; cf. *he aha sananā*), *kihikihi* or *'ōpū hemo* (loose belly), *lepalepa, maha 'ō'ō* (piercing brow), *mālailena, maoli, pālaha*, and *po'o nui* (large head). (PNP *kasi*.)
- ahia**. vs. Faded.
- 'ahia**. 1. Same as *'āhiahia*. 2. inter. How many.
- 'ā.hia**. n. Tinder resulting from plowing with the fire plow; the powdery rubbings that ignite.
- ahi.ahi**. nvi. Evening, late afternoon; to become evening. *Ua mana'o māua e hiki 'ē i 'ane'i, 'o ke ahiahi 'ia 'ana ihola ia*, we thought of arriving here earlier but were overtaken by evening. **ho.'āhi.ahi, ho'o.ahi.ahi**. To become evening; to spend an evening; to detain until evening; to darken, obscure. *Aia a hele aku au e ho'āhiahi me 'olua*, when I get there I'll spend the evening with you two. *E kali kāua a ho'āhiahi iho*, let's wait until evening begins to fall. (PPN *afiafi*.)
- 'ahi.'ahi**. nvt. To defame, slander, tattle against; false report, defamation, slander. *He po'e . . . e hele ana me ka 'ahi'ahi* (Ier. 6.28), people . . . walking with slanders.
- 'ā.hia.hia**. vs. Faint, obscure, faded; dim, as colors in tapa or cloth. *'Ula'ula 'āhiahia*, faded red.
- ahi.ahi.hia**. Pas/imp. of *ahiahi*; overtaken by evening. (Gram. 6.6.3.)
- Ahi.ahi Kaliki.maka**. n. Christmas Eve, Christmas night.
- Ahi.ahi Maka.hiki Hou**. n. New Year's Eve.
- ahi 'ai honua**. n. Volcano, volcanic fire. *Lit.*, fire destroying land.
- 'ā.hie.hie**. vs. Silvery gray, faded. *Ni'ihau*.
- 'ā.hihi**. n. 1. A low spreading bush (*Metrosideros* sp.), formerly numerous in Nu'u-anu. Also *'āhihi lehua, lehua 'āhihi, 'āhihi kū ma kua*. 2. Any plant with long runners or creepers, as cup of gold; any creeping vine. Cf. *hihi*, entangled.
- 'ahi kananā**. Same as *kananā*; a shark or a fierce and courageous fighter. See *nanā*. *Ka pūkaua 'ahi kananā*, the warrior, fierce as an *'ahi* fish.
- ahi.kao**. n. Fireworks (perhaps from Eng. scow [*kao*], as fireworks were first displayed from ships of explorers). Also *kao lele*.
- ahi.kao lele**. n. Skyrocket, rocket.
- ahi.koe**. n. Match. Also *ahipele, kūkaepele*. *Lit.*, scratching fire.
- ahi koli**. v. To pass fire from one candlenut to the next on a chain (*koli*) or candlenut torch. *Lit.*, to fire the torch.
- 'ahiku**. num. Seven (especially in counting in a series); seven times.
- ahi lele**. n. Fire fountain, firebrands thrown over cliffs at Ka-maile, Kaua'i. See *ahi* and chant, *Ka-ua-hae*.
- 'ā.hilu**. n. Bits of crustacea and bones found at the opening of an octopus burrow.
- ahi.makani**. n. Gasoline. *Lit.*, wind fire.
- 'ā.hina**. 1. vs. Gray, gray- or white-haired. 2. n. Blue denim cloth, dungarees, blue jeans.
- 'ā.hina.hina**. 1. Same as *'āhina* 1, 2. 2. n. The silver-sword (*Argyroxiphium sandwicense*), a native plant found only at altitudes of 1,870 m or more on Maui and Hawai'i; the many long silvery leaves forming a rounded rosette to 60 cm in diameter; about a hundred purplish, daisy-like flowers borne on an erect, leafy stem, which is about 1.8 m high. (Neal 845-7.) Also *hinahina*. 3. n. A native spreading shrub to 1 m high, (*Artemisia australis*); leaves divided into narrow segments, hoary on under side; flowers in panicles, small, daisy-like. Pounded leaves are used for asthma. (Neal 852.) Also *hinahina*. 4. Same as *hinahina* 2, Florida moss.
- 'ā.hina kua.hiwi**. n. A native fern (*Cyrtomium caryotidium*), with fronds 25 to 35 cm long, once divided into 6 to 18 broadly sickle-shaped pinnae, lobed at the base. Also *kā'ape'ape*.
- ahio**. vi. Lazy, indolent; to shirk work, loiter.
- 'ahi pā.laha**. n. Albacore, *Thunnus alalunga* (family Scombridae). *Lit.*, flat *'ahi*.
- ahi.pele**. n. Match.
- ahi pō.ka'u.wili**. n. Pinwheel (fireworks).
- 'ā.hiu**. 1. vs. Wild, untamed, as animals or plants. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a wind common in the mountains of Kahana, O'ahu and by the sea. *I aloha a'e au i ka 'Āhiu o Kahana*, I greet the Wild Wind of Kahana.
- 'ā.hiu.hiu**. Redup. of *'āhiu* 1.
- 'ā.hiwa**. vs. Dark, dusky, somber.
- aho**. 1. n. Line, cord, lashing, fishing line, thong, kite string. *Aho kakele, aho kālewa*, trolling line. *Aho loa*, long line, as with several hooks for deep-sea fishing or for sounding. (PPN *afo*.) 2. nvi. Breath; to breathe.
