

- aka.hele.** vi. Slow or moderate, cautious, careful, prudent (see ex., *pukapai*). *Me ke akahele*, circumspectly, prudently. *Ka no'ono'o akahele*, careful consideration. *E hikiwawe mai i ka lohe, e akahele ho'i i ka 'olelo*, be quick to hear but slow to speak. **ho.'ā.kahelo.** Caus/sim.; precautionary; to take precautions.
- 'aka hene, 'aka hene.hene.** vt. To laugh at teasingly, jeer. *'Aka hene iki*, to titter.
- 'akahi.** 1. num. One (especially in counting in a series). *Pō'akahi*, Monday. *'Akahi kahi ana, 'o ka 'Ewa iki, 'o ka 'Ewa nui*, a single unit, then lesser 'Ewa and greater 'Ewa. 2. idiom. For the first time, never before (usually followed by *nō*). (Gram. 4.6.) *'Akahi nō 'oe ā hiki ma'ane'i?* Is this the first time you have come here? Have you ever been here before? *'Akahi nō au ā 'ike iā Hilo*, this is the first time I've seen Hilo. *'Akahi nō au ā lohe i ka hekili*, I've never heard such thunder. 3. idiom. To have just. *'Akahi nō ā pau ka'u ha'awina*, my lesson is just finished.
- 'akahi akahi.** idiom. Inexperienced, trying out for the first time; novice, beginner. *E akahele ka mea 'akahi akahi i ka lu'u*, let the inexperienced be careful in diving. *'A'ole nō i 'ike loa no ka mea 'akahi akahi, [I] did not know much because of inexperience.*
- aka.hi'u.** n. Base of caudal fin. Also *akaakahi'u*.
- aka.hoe.** vt. To paddle carefully, silently.
- aka.holo.** vi. To sail or run cautiously.
- a kai.** By the sea. *Kō a kai*, those by the sea.
- 'ā.ka'i.ka'i.** vs. Large, potbellied, plump.
- aka iki.** nvi. To laugh a little, snicker.
- akaka.** Var. spelling of *akaaka 1*.
- 'akaka.** 1. nvi. A rent, split, chink, separation; to crack, split, scale. 2. Also *agata*. n. Agate. *Eng.*
- 'aka.kane.** n. Hawai'i 'ākepa (honey creeper), *Loxops coccinea coccinea*, endangered. See *'ākepa*.
- 'akakē, agatē.** n. Agate. *Eng.*
- 'aka.kē.** vs. Spry, quick, nimble, especially about getting into people's way or into trouble.
- 'akaki, agati.** n. Agate. *Eng.*
- 'aka.kihi.** Same as *'akakē*. *Rare.*
- aka ki'i.** n. Negative of a photograph.
- aka.kole.** nvs. Destitution, poverty; poor.
- aka.kū.** vs. Vision, trance; reflection, as in a mirror; hallucination; to see a vision. **ho.'āka.kū.** Caus/sim. 2. See *kino aka*.
- aka.kū ā.nue.nue.** n. The phenomenon known as the Specter of the Brocken, seen at Hale-a-ka-lā Crater. *Lit.*, rainbow apparition. **ho.'āka.kū ā.nue.nue.** Caus/sim.
- aka.ku'u.** vi. Lessened, diminished, mitigated; to cease, abate, grow calm, stop, as wind, surf, rain, anger, grief, pain; settled, calmed, quieted, appeased. *Ua akaku'u mai ke ali'i, 'a'ole inu lama hou*, the chief has calmed down, he doesn't drink any more.
- 'ā.kala.** 1. vs. Pink. 2. n. Two endemic raspberries (*Rubus hawaiiensis* and *R. macraei*); and the thimbleberry (*R. rosaefolius*), from southeastern Asia. (Neal 390-1.) Also *'ākalakala, 'ōla'a*. 3. n. Dye made from 'ākala juice. 4. n. A pink tapa. 5. Same as *kala*, a seaweed.
- 'ā.kala.kala.** 1. Same as *'ākala 2, 3*. 2. vs. Pinkish. *Rare.*
- aka.lani.** Same as *akaakalani*.
- aka.lau.** n. The ghost or spirit of a living person seen by others, a sign of calamity. *Lit.*, many shadows.
- aka.lei.** n. String of multicolored glass beads. *Lit.*, bead reflections.
- aka.lewa.** vi. To sway the hips daintily, deliberately, and gracefully. See *aka-, lewa 2*.
- 'aka.lio, asario.** n. Farthing. (Latin *assarius*.)
- aka.luli.** vi. To move slowly, carefully. See *aka-, luli*.
- 'akama, adama.** vs. Adamant. *Eng.*
- aka.mai.** nvs. Smart, clever, expert; smartness, skill, wit. Cf. *akeakamai*. *Nā 'olelo akamai a Kolomona*, the proverbs of Solomon. **ho.'āka.mai.** To make wise or smart; to make a pretense of wisdom; to show off, display erudition; theorist. (PPN *'atamai*.)
- 'Akamu, Adamu.** n. Adam. *Eng.*
- aka.nahe.** vs. Careful, gentle in behavior and speech. See *aka-, nahe*.
- aka.noho.** vi. To sit quietly, live cautiously. See *aka-, noho 2*.
- aka.'olelo.** vt. To speak cautiously, deliberately, in moderation. See *aka-, 'olelo*.
- aka.o'o.** vs. Stingy, miserly, hard.
- 'aka.pane.** Same as *'apapane*, a bird.
- 'ā.kau.** 1. nvs. Right (not left). Cf. *mākaukau, hema*. *Ma ka 'ākau, huli*, right, face; *nānā ma ka 'ākau*, dress right [military commands]. *Lālau ka 'ākau, lū ka hema* (saying), the right [hand] grabs, the left throws away [of a spendthrift]. (PPN *mata'u, PCP katau*.) 2. n. North (when one faces west, the direction of the sun's course, the right hand is to the north).
- akaua.helo.** nvi. To go here and there, vagabond; vagabond.
- aka.'ula.** n. Red sunset, looked upon as a sign that rain will clear. *Lit.*, red shadow.
- ake.** 1. n. Liver. Cf. *akeloa, akemāmā*. *Ma'i 'ai ake*, tuberculosis. (PPN *'ate*.) 2. vt. To desire, wish, be eager, yearn [the emotions and intelligence were thought to be centered within the body]. *'Ake ho'oipoi-po*, amorous, "horny". *Ake nui nō lākou e hā'ule ka ua*, they want very much for rain to fall.
- 'ā.kē.** vt. To find fault, criticize, slander. See *kē*.
- ā.keā.** 1. nvs. Broad, wide, spacious, open, unobstructed, public, at large; full, as a skirt; breadth, width. *Fig.*, liberal. *Piliwaiwai ākea*, open gambling. *Ākea ka no'ono'o*, broad-minded. *Hō'ike ākea*, a public report; to lay before the public. *Ke ho'olaha 'ia aku nei ma ke ākea*, there is being widely advertised hereby. **ho'ā.keā.** To widen, broaden, extend, enlarge, make public; broadening, expansion; extension; to escape (*rare*). *E ho'ākea i ke kolone*, extend the column [a military command]. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Var. of *Wākea*.
- 'ā.keā.** n. Starboard or outer hull of a double canoe. (PPN *katea*.)
- ake.aka.mai.** nvs. A lover of wisdom, seeker after knowledge, philosopher, scientist, scholar; philosophy, science; scientific. *Lit.*, to desire wisdom.
- ake.ake.** vs. Quick, ready, as to do a kindly deed, helpful.
- 'akē.'akē.** n. Hawaiian storm petrel (*Oceanodroma castro cryptoleucura*).
- ā.keā.keā.** 1. Same as *hākeakea*, faded; to fade. 2. n. A kind of gray tapa.
- 'ā.ke'a.ke'a.** nvt. To block, hinder, obstruct, interfere; obstruction, block.
- ā.kē.kē.** 1. Var. of *kēkē*, potbellied. 2. n. Name given for the 'o'opu hue, puffer fish, and listed by Malo. (Malo 46.)
- 'ā.keke.** n. Cindery or pebbly soil; cinder.
- 'ake.ke'e.** n. A honey creeper (*Loxops coccinea caeruleirostris*). Usually called *'ākepa* in *Eng.* Also *'ō'ūhollowai*.
- 'ake.keke.** 1. n. Ruddy turnstone (*Arenaria interpres*), a winter migrant to Hawai'i, occurring in small flocks which rise and wheel together. Also *keke*. 2. vi. To talk loquaciously in a friendly, hospitable manner, bidding a guest to feel at home, make himself comfortable, eat plenty. Cf. *heahea*. 3. Redup. of *'akeke*, cinder.
- 'Ake.lanika, Atelanika.** nvs. Atlantic. *Eng.*
- 'akele, akere.** n. Acre. *Eng.*
- 'ā.kele.kele.** nvi. To escape from danger or sickness; to have a narrow escape.
- 'ake.lika, akerida.** See *'ūhini 'akelika*.
- ake.loa.** n. Spleen. *Lit.*, long liver.
- ake.maka.** n. Edible raw liver.
- ake.makani.** n. Lung. Also *akemāmā, akepāhola*. *Lit.*, wind liver.
- ake.mā.mā.** n. Lung. *Lit.*, light liver.
- akena.** vt. To boast, brag, admire, praise. *Kū'ē akena*, to taunt, defy. *Keiki akena ā ha'anui*, child boaster and exaggerator.
