

- ened, cloudy, shady; to cloud, overshadow (sometimes confused with *eaea* and *'ea'ea*).
- 'ea hanu pa'a.** n. Condition of frequent colds. *Lit.*, 'ea with hardened breath.
- 'ea houpo lewa.lewa.** n. Great hunger, perhaps due to diabetes. *Lit.*, loose-hanging diaphragm 'ea.
- 'ea huna.** n. Dizzy spells, dizziness; latent 'ea disease (Kam. 64:103).
- e (verb) ai.** Particles indicating imperative/intentive mood and accompanying subordinate verbs (*ai* in this case is the anaphoric *ai*). (Gram. 5.4, 7.3.)
- 'ea kai wawaka.** n. Impaired vision, perhaps labyrinthitis.
- 'ea kā.kua.** n. A disease, perhaps secondary lues (Kam. 64:115).
- 'ea kā.molo.wā.** n. Condition of listlessness.
- 'ea kua nenēke.** n. A variety of 'ea, a land tortoise. *Lit.*, tortoise with back fitted into sections.
- 'ea kū.ka'a.** n. Disease with swelling symptoms.
- 'ea kū manawa.** n. Severe headaches, perhaps due to high blood pressure. *Lit.*, 'ea at fontanel.
- e (verb) ala.** Same as *e (verb) lā*. 'Oia ia lepo 'ula āu e 'ike ala, it's that red dirt you see over there.
- 'ea mā.hani.** n. A type of 'ea described as evanescent. (Kam. 64:103.)
- 'ea mā.lani.** nvs. Light-brown in color. See 'ea 2.
- ea.mā.mā.** n. Gas. *Lit.*, light air.
- e (verb) ana.** Particles indicating incompleting action and future. Gram. 5.2. (PCP 'e verb 'ana.)
- ea.ola.mā.mā.** n. Oxygen. *Lit.*, light life breath.
- 'ea 'ō.lēna.** n. Jaundice, hepatitis.
- 'ea pō.niu.** n. Dizziness, vertigo.
- 'ea 'ula.** nvs. Wine-colored, such a color.
- 'ea wāhi pa'a.** n. Osteomalacia, gradual softening of the bones.
- 'ea wawaka.** n. Acute childhood 'ea disease. (Kam. 64:105.)
- e'e.** 1. nvi. To climb on, mount, get on, go aboard, board, embark; one who climbs, mounts, boards; step. Cf. *e'e kuahiwi*, *e'e moku*, *hikie'e*. *Kai e'e*, tidal wave. **ho.'ē.ē.** To rise or swell, as surf; to mount, as a surfer mounts a wave. (2 Oihn. 35.24.) *Kai ho'ē'e*, tidal wave, deep sea. *Ho'ē'e akula ia i ka noho maluna o kona hoki* (Kin. 22.3), he saddled his ass. (PPN *heke*.) 2. Same as *a'a* 2, to extend greetings.
- 'ē.ē.** vs. Hard, stiff, dry. Cf. *ka'e'e*.
- 'ē.'ē.** 1. Redup. of 'ē 1; contrary, peculiar, opposite; adversely. *He 'ē'ē wale nō kona mana'o*, his opinion is in opposition. *E pale ana i ka wawā lapuwale, a me ke kū 'ē'ē 'ana i ka mea i kapa hewa 'ia he na'auao* (I Tim. 6.20), avoiding profane babblings and oppositions of the thing falsely called science. **ho.'ē.'ē.** To keep away from, avoid. (PPN *keseke*, PEP *kekeke*.) 2. n. Yellow underwing feathers of the 'ō'ō, a bird, as used in featherwork. 3. n. Armpit. Also *pō'ae'ae*, *po'ē'ē*; see *kui'ē'ē*. (PCP *kekeke*.)
- e'ea.** Redup. of *ea* 3; to rise up frequently, as in water; to bob up and down. *E'ea a'e ke po'o o ka honu i ka 'ilikai*, the head of the turtle appeared again and again on the surface of the sea.
- 'e'ea.** 1. vs. Quick ready, expert. *He 'e'ea nō kona kūlana*, he is quick in his ways. 2. n. A bird, said to be an adult 'alaiaha. (KL line 307.)
- 'e'e'e.** Redup. of *e'e* 1; to keep climbing over everything, as an active child; mischievous.
- 'e'ēhi.** Same as *hehi*, to step on. 'E'ēhi ihola ia a pa'a, he placed his feet down and stood firm.
- 'e'e.hia.** nvs. Overcome with fearful reverence, terror-stricken, awe-stricken; awe-inspiring, solemn; fear, reverence, awe, terror; wierd. *Ka 'e'ehia iā Iēhowa* (2 Oihn. 17.10), fear of Jehovah. *Piha au i ka 'e'ehia*, I am filled with awe.
- e'ehu.** Same as *ehuehu*, healthy.
- 'e'ehu.** Redup. of 'ehu 5; reddish; a number of 'ehu persons. *Pala 'e'ehu*, to turn red or yellow, as leaves or fruit (riper than *pala hā'ama*).
- 'e'ei.** Offensive, filthy, fly-ridden. (And.)
- 'e'ei.ao.** Rare var. of *pepeiao*, ear. *Mō ka 'e'eiao o ka pua'a*, cut off is the ear of the pig.
- 'e'ei.ēhi.ēhi.** Same as 'e'ei. (AP.)
- 'e'e.'ina.** vi. To creak, crackle. Cf. 'a'ina, 'u'ina.
- 'E'eka.** Same as 'Eka 2, a wind.
- 'e'ēke.** 1. Redup. of 'eke 2. Cf. *mū'e'eke*. 'E'eke maila i ka wela o ke ahi, shrinking back from the heat of the fire. 2. n. Name given for a hard-shelled crab (no data).
- 'e'ēke.loi.** vt. To tap a drum slowly, as to accompany a chant.
- 'e'ēku.** Same as 'eku'eku. *E Kāne-pua'a, e 'e'eku e kūlana, e ho'owali*, o Kāne-pua'a, root, and make ridges and furrows.
- e'e kua.hiwi.** v. To climb mountains; mountain climber.
- 'e'ēle.** Same as 'ele'ele 1, but used chiefly in old chants. *Ka manu 'e'ele koi* (For. 5:99), the black bird begged.
- 'e'ēle.koa.** vs. Stormy. *Kū 'ia ka malama 'e'elekoa*, weathered the stormy month [to have endured hardships].
- 'e'ēle.kū.** Redup. of 'elekū; blackened or darkened, as leaves or fruit due to maturity or to pelting by storms; dark, gloomy, as clouds. *Ma ia malama ua 'e'elekū ka lani i nā ao ua . . . a ua 'e'elekū ho'i nā lau o nā lā'au a me nā mea ulu i ke o'o* (Kep. 93), in this month the sky is dark with rain clouds . . . and the leaves of trees and growing things are dark with maturity. *Ma ia malama o Nana, ua pau ka 'e'elekū o ka lau o nā lā'au i ka noke a ka ua ma nā lā o ka ho'oilo* (Kep. 89), in this month of Nana, the dark bruising of the leaves of trees by the pelting of the rains of the days of winter has ceased.
- 'e'elo.** 1. Redup. of 'elo; drenched, soaked. **hō.'e'elo.** To wet, drench, soak; tearfully sulky, as a crying child. *Ua hō'e'elo*, drenching rain. 2. vs. Loitering; to dilly-dally. *Rare*.
- 'E'elo-koa.** Name of a storm from the northeast of Wai-mea, Hawai'i. (And.)
- e'e moku.** nvi. To board a ship; ship passenger; immigrant.
- 'e'ena.** vs. 1. Shy, timid, wary, wild, afraid, fearsome, untamed; to shy away. Cf. 'ena 2, *hā'e'ena*. 'E'ena *Hā'ena i ke ehu kai*, Hā'ena is fearsome because of sea spray. 2. Extraordinary. Cf. 'ē 1. *He 'e'ena a mīkolo-hua ka 'ōlelo*, impressive and eloquent in speech. *Kani 'e'ena ka pahu i ka moana*, the drum sounds weirdly over the ocean.
- 'e'epa.** nvs. Extraordinary, incomprehensible, abnormal, deceitful, peculiar, as persons with miraculous powers; such persons. Many 'e'epa characters in mythology were born in strange forms, as a plant, an animal, or a piece of rope. Cf. 'epa 1, 'epa'epa, *kino 'e'epa*. The *menehune*, *Nāwā*, and *Nāmū* of Wao-lani in Nu'u-anu Valley were 'e'epa. Trickery or deceit that passes comprehension is also 'e'epa. **hō.'e'epa.** Mysterious, mystifying, incomprehensible. *Hō'e'epa wale ho'i nā hana a kēlā keiki*, that boy's behavior is certainly mysterious.
- 'e'eu.** 1. vi. To crawl, creep, as an insect. Cf. 'eu 2. (PCP *kekeu*.) 2. nvi. Shuddering sensation of revulsion (less strong than *mania*); to rise in horror, flinch (sometimes interpreted as a portent). 'E'eu ka 'ili o ke po'o, the scalp of the head flinches. 'E'eu a'ela ka hulu o ka 'ilio, the dog's hair bristles [in anger].
- 'e'ewa.** vi. To make a wry face, pout, as in derision; to protrude the lips mockingly.
- ē.hā.** Same as *ēhē*. *He wahi ma'i ēhē, ēhā, no 'Io-lani, ēhē, ēhā* (chant), a genital chant, oh, oh, for 'Io-lani, oh, oh.
- 'eha.** nvs. Hurt, in pain, painful, aching, sore, pained; pain, injury, ailment, suffering, soreness, aching; to hurt, pain, cause suffering or pang. See *mea 'eha*. Gram. 4.4. 'Eha koni, throbbing ache; *fig.*, throbbing love. *He 'eha konikoni i ka pu'uwai*, the heart throbs with agony [of love]. 'Eha i ka 'eha lima 'ole, aching with an ache not inflicted by [human] hands [love]. 'A'ole e 'eha ke keiki o Kaua'i iā'oe (For. 5:411), you
