

- '**ēke.pu'u**. n. A bird (no data). (KL line 355.)
 'ē.kōu. Same as 'ēheu 1, 2. (Cf. Easter keke'u, shoulder.)
 'ēke.ūla. n. A type of banana. (Kam. 76:38.)
 'ēke wai wela. n. Hot-water bag.
 'ēki. n. Ace. Eng. 'Eki pihulu, ace of spades.
 'ēki. n. 1. Bayonet. Cf. ki, to shoot, and 'ēlau waiki. 2. Place where ti plants grow.
 'ēki.ēki. n. Hawaiian tern (*Anous* sp.). Cf. noio.
 ēkiki.lau. nvs. A stench that draws flies; bad-smelling.
 ēko. Var. of weko, bad-smelling.
 ē.koa. Same as koa haole, false koa (*Leucaena leucocephala*), a plant.
 ēko.ēko. Redup. of ēko; extremely bad-smelling.
 'ēkoko. Same as 'akoko and koko, shrubs and trees.
 'ēkolu. num. Three; three times. Cf. kolu, 'akolu.
 'ēku. nvt. To root, as a pig. Fig., prow of a canoe. (PEP ketu.)
 'ēkua. Pas/imp. of 'ēku. *E Kāne-pua'a*, 'ēkua i uka, 'ēkua i kai (Kep. 59), O Pig-Kāne, root inland, root seaward. (PCP ketua.)
 'Eku.kola, Ekuadora. nvs. Ecuador; Ecuadorian. Eng.
 'ēku.ēku. Redup. of 'ēku; to soften the earth, as for planting (Kep. 155).
 'ēku.lē.kū. n. Digging place. *Aia i 'ō ka 'ekulēkū a lākou*, over there is their digging place.
 ē (verb) lā. Similar to ē (verb) nei, except that lā indicates action away. See Gram. 5.2.
 'ēla. n. Ale. Eng.
 'ē.lā'a. Var. of 'āla'a, a tree.
 'ēla kinika. n. Ginger ale. Eng.
 ē lā.kou ala. Similar to ē lākou nei, but persons addressed are farther away.
 ē lā.kou nei. pronoun. You (pl.), you there (usually affectionate). (Shortened vocative ē + pronoun lākou + zero demon.: Gram. 8.2.) *E lākou nei e pe'e ho'opue nei*, 'a'ole 'o 'oukou lohe i ke kani o nā pū (Kel. 81)? O you who are hiding crouched over here, don't you hear the sound of the guns?
 ē.lama. Same as lama 1, ebony. Rare.
 'ē.lau. n. 1. Tip, point, end, top, extremity, extreme, snapper (of whip). Also wēlau. 2. Wisp of breeze. 3. Bayonet, spear point, short spear.
 'ē.lau alelo. n. Tongue tip.
 'ē.lau wai.kī. n. Gun bayonet.
 -ēle. See 'iele, lauele, luaiete, ntele, ninauele.
 'ēle. 1. nvs. Black (less used than 'ele'ele). Cf. also 'e'ele, pā'ele. (PPN kele.) 2. n. Embryo. 'Ele Kū, embryo of Kū [said of a child born on the night or day of Kū]. 3. Short for ka'ele 1. 4. n. Water hole, dark spring covered with growth. Cf. kele.
 'ēle-. 1. Old. See 'elehine, 'elekule, 'elemakule, lā'ele. 2. Prefix to names of directions used by priests; see below.
 'ēle.ao. n. 1. Plant louse, aphid; germ, blight; blighted, as by 'eleao. Fig., troublemaker. *Ua 'eleao 'ia ke kalo*, the taro is blighted by insects. 2. A native fungus (*Gnomonia iliau*), parasitic on leaf sheaths of sugar cane. 3. Time of light, daylight, a term used in kuwā prayers, as to indicate that a new house is free from taboo and may be occupied. Cf. 'eleua, kuwā 2. 4. n. Door at the leeward end of a house. Cf. 'eleua.
 'ēle.au. n. 1. Period of darkness. 2. Perhaps same as 'aki'aki, a seaweed. Maui.
 'ēle.ēle. 1. nvs. Black, dark, the black color of Hawaiian eyes. Also 'ene'ene. hō.ēle.ēle. To blacken, darken, become dark. (PPN kekeke.) 2. n. Variety of tapa said to have originated at Kau-makani, Maui; it was dyed with candlenut, pā'ihi, and black mud. 3. n. Long, filamentous, green, edible seaweeds (*Enteromorpha prolifera*). Some kinds are among the most popular in Hawai'i, being eaten raw as condiments at feasts. Called pīpīlani on Maui. 4. n. A cooking banana (a form of *Musa xparadisiaca*), valued for shiny black skin of trunk, used for designs worked into pandanus mats and hats. (Neal 249.) Also hinupua'a. 5. Same as hinupua'a and naioea, varieties of taro. 6. Same as māikoiko, a variety of sugar cane. 7. n. A variety of sweet potato.
 'ēle.ēle kani.kau. n. Black crepe worn for mourning.
 'ēle.ēle.kū. Redup. of 'elekū; unattractively dark and ugly, coal-black.
 'ēle.ēle mā.koko. n. A taro cultivar. (TC 3.)
 'ēle.ēle pa'a. n. Coal-black.
 'ēle.ēle.pī. nvs. Agitated, turbulent, tumultuous. 'Ele-ēlept ka waha, blabber-mouth. 2. Same as 'elept.
 'ēle.ēle.leu. Redup. of 'eleu; vivacious, energetic, lively. hō.ēle.ēle.leu. Caus/sim.; vivacious, energetic, full of life.
 'ēle.he'i. Var. of 'ekeke'i, short.
 'ēle.he'u. 1. nvs. Mutilated, deprived of some essential part; mayhem. Rare. Cf. manuhe'u. 2. Angry. (AP.)
 'ēle.hine. n. Old woman. Rare. See luahine.
 'ēle hiwa. nvs. Coal-black, jet-black, all black. See chant, 'elemoe.
 'ēle.honua. nvs. Priests' name for west.
 ēlehu. n. Slate or ash-colored pumice. Rare. Cf. lehu.
 'ēle.i. nvs. Blue-black, shiny black. Fig., select, choice. *He mea 'ele'i kēia i ko'u mana'o*, this is choice, in my opinion.
 'ēle.i.honua. Same as 'elehonua.
 'ēle.i.lani. Same as 'elelani.
 'ēle.iki. vt. To bear a grudge. *Ua 'eleiki wale aku nō ia i nā hoahānau*, he nursed a little grudge against the cousins.
 'ēle.io. nvi. To go after secretly and speedily; agile, sly; the name of a famous runner on Maui (For. 4:483-7).
 'ēleka. n. Elk. Eng.
 'ēle.ke'i. Var. of 'ekeke'i, short.
 'ēle.kū. 1. n. Coarse vesicular basalt. (PEP keletuu; cf. Marquesan ke'etu.) 2. n. Stone polisher or rubber made of this rock. 3. nvs. Entirely black, coal-black, said jokingly of dark people, including Negroes. See chant, 'elemoe. 4. n. Priests' name for north.
 'ēle.kule. n. Old fellow, old chap. Cf. the common 'elemakule. 'Eleu nō kahi 'elekule, the old fellow is sly.
 'ēle.kuma. n. Small crabs (*Xanthidae* spp.).
 'ēle.lani. nvs. Priests' name for east.
 'ēle.lau. Var. of welelau, tip.
 'ēlele. n. Messenger, delegate, ambassador, envoy, any diplomatic representative. Also 'alele. (PCP kelele.)
 'ēlele waha 'ole. n. Letter, written message. Lit., messenger without mouth.
 ēlelo. Same as alelo, tongue.
 ēlelo lua. nvs. Double-tongued, deceitful; trickster. *Mai puni 'oe, he elelo lua*, don't believe, [he] is deceitful.
 'ēle.lū. n. Cockroaches (Blattidae).
 'ēle.lū kea. n. A cockroach that has shed its skin and is light (kea) in color; a term of ridicule for an unclean white person.
 'ēle.lū ki.kē.kē. n. A large American cockroach (*Periplaneta americana*). Lit., knocking cockroach.
 'ēle.lū lā'a loa. n. A cockroach, kitchen roach.
 'ēle.lū lepo. n. Burrowing cockroach (*Pycnoscelus indicus*). Lit., earth cockroach.
 'ēlelū papa. n. A cockroach. (Malo 41.)
 'ēle.lū 'ula.ūla. n. Large, brown cockroaches, such as the American cockroach (*Periplaneta americana*), and the somewhat smaller Australasian cockroach (*P. australasiae*).
 'ēle.makai.ā.uli. n. An expert taro farmer (no data). (For. 5:681.)
 'ēle.makule. nvs. Old man; to become an old man; old (of males). See saying, hopena. hō.ēle.makule. To behave like an old man; to pretend to be an old man.
 'ēle.mā.kule. Plural of 'elemakule.
 'ēle.mihī. Same as 'alamihī and 'eleptī, a small black crab.
 'ēle.mika, eremita. Hermit. (MK 7.) Probably French.
 'ēle.mimo. Var. of alamimo, quick.
 'ēle.mio. 1. vs. Tapering. 2. vt. To snatch without being seen, as by a thief. *Ma'ane'i iho nei nō ku'u 'eke'eke,*
