

- eia kā ua 'elemio 'ia aku nei*, my purse was right here, and then it is snatched away.
- 'ele.moe.** 1. vs. Dark, still, as sea or forest. *Kai 'ōma'o, 'elekū, 'ele hiwa, 'elemoe, 'elewawā* (chant for Ka-lā-kaua), sea green, jet-black, sacred black, silent black, tumultuous black. 2. n. Priests' name for south.
- 'ē.lemu.** n. Buttocks.
- 'ele.paio.** 1. nvi. A species of flycatcher with subspecies on Hawai'i (*Chasiempis sandwichensis sandwichensis*), Kaua'i (*C. sandwichensis sclateri*), and O'ahu (*C. sandwichensis gayi*). The Kaua'i subspecies is also called *'āpekepeke*. This bird was believed to be the goddess of canoe makers, hence the saying *ua 'elepaio 'ia ka wa'a*, the canoe is [marked] by the *'elepaio* [an *'elepaio* bird pecking slowly on a tree trunk for insects signified that the trunk was insect-ridden and not suitable for a canoe (see *kani 1*); the saying may be applied to any failure]. The name also refers to one who craves fish but does not go fishing, as the cry of the bird was thought to suggest *'ono ka i'a, 'ono ka i'a*, fish is delicious, fish is delicious. 2. n. A native variety of taro; the leaves are mottled with white. (HP 17).
- 'ele.pani, elepani.** nvs. Elephant. *Eng. Ka niho 'elepani* (1 Nal. 10.22), ivory.
- 'ele.pani kai.** n. Sea elephant.
- 'ele.pī.** Same as *'alamihī, 'ele'elepī*, and *'elemihī*, a small black crab. See *kono 'elepī*.
- 'elou.** vs. Active, alert, energetic, lively, nimble, quick, dexterous, agile, spry, sprightly, prompt. Also *'uleu. hō.'elou.* Caus/sim.; to animate, stir into action, animated.
- 'Ele.ū.** 1. n. A dark-skinned people said to be descended from a chief of this name. 2. (*Not cap.*) A hard stone, sometimes used as a fish god.
- 'eloua.** n. 1. Darkness of rain or rain clouds. 2. A new house before it has been made *noa*, or free from taboo. Cf. *'eleao 3*. 3. Door on the weather end of a house. Cf. *'eleao 4*. 4. Ancestor or aged male of a family. 5. A major illness (no data).
- 'ele.uli.** 1. nvs. Grayish black. 2. A rare type of dark-gray or perfumed tapa. (FS 18-9).
- 'ele.wawā.** nvs. Dark and tumultuous, as sea or forest. See chant, *'elemoe*.
- 'ele.weka.** n. Elevator. *Eng.*
- ele.wiki.** Same as *alawiki*, to hurry.
- 'eli.** vt. To dig, excavate. Also *'ali, pā'eli.* (PPN *keli.*)
- 'elia.** Pas/imp. of *'eli*.
- 'eli.'eli.** Redup. of *'eli*; to dig often. *Fig.*, firmly rooted, profound, deep, as a taboo, or its removal; reverence. *'Amama, 'eli'eli kapu, 'eli'eli noa* (Kep. 55), the taboo is over, profound has been the taboo, profound is the freeing. *'Eli'eli kau mai*, may a profound reverence alight [solemn supplication at the end of prayers]. *Ā 'eli'eli kūlana i Hawai'i*, and are firmly rooted in Hawai'i.
- 'elima.** num. Five; five times. Cf. *lima, 'alima*.
- 'eli ua.** v. To dig a trench so that rain water will run off. (FS 211.)
- 'elo.** vs. Wet, soggy. *Pulu 'elo*, soaked, drenched. *hō.'elo.* Caus/sim.
- 'elo.'elo.** Redup. of *'elo*, very wet, drenched. See ex., *Kū-lani-hāko'i. hō.'elo.'elo.* Caus/sim. *Ka ua hō'elo'elo*, a drenching rain.
- 'elua.** num. Two; twice Cf. *lua, 'alua. 'Elua a'u hele 'ana i laila*, I went there twice.
- elu.ēhe.** n. A Moloka'i name for *'ālei*, a shrub.
- 'eme.lala, emerala.** n. Emerald. *Eng.*
- 'eme.paea.** n. Empire. *Eng.*
- 'eme.pake, emebase.** n Embassy. *Eng.*
- 'eme.pake.koa, emebasedoa.** n. Ambassador. *Eng.*
- 'eme.pela, emepera.** nvs. Emperor. *Eng. Aupuni 'emepela*, empire.
- emi.** 1. nvs. To diminish, reduce, depreciate, grow smaller, subside, wane, decrease, recede, ebb; to lose vigor, droop, lower; low, reduced, thin; reduction, decrease, loss; mitigated. See ex., *manoninia. Emi iho*, to go down, settle (as earth). *Emi ke kino*, to lose weight. *Emi mau nō ke olakono*, the health keeps failing. *Emi hope*, to back up. *ho'ēmi, ho'o.ēmi.* To reduce, diminish (Puk. 21.10), lessen, draw back, curtail, discount. *Ho'ēmi kino, ho'ēmi momona*, reduce in weight. (PCP *emi.*) 2. vs. Cheap. *ho'ēmi.* To lower the price, cheapen; cheap. *Kū'ai ho'ēmi*, reduction sale. *Ho'ēmi panakō*, bank discount. 3. n. Flat (in music).
- emi.ēmi.** Redup. of *emi 1, 2*; lowering, decreasing, diminishing, dwindling, lagging slowly; backward. *ho'ēmi.ēmi.* Caus/sim.; to retreat, lag, hesitate; to lower a price, to bargain.
- emi hope.** vi. To return, go backward, withdraw, back up. *ho'ēmi hope.* Caus/sim. *Ho'ēmi hope i ka wa'a*, to back water.
- emi kua.** vi. To go backward with stooped back, as from the presence of a chief.
- 'emila, emira.** n. Emir. *Eng.*
- emi pū.** vs. To lose weight rapidly, as due to sickness.
- 'emo.** nvi. A waiting, delay; to wait, delay (often used with a negative). *'A'ohe i 'emo, hiki ana ke ka'a*, in hardly any time at all, the car arrived. (PCP *kemo.*)
- 'emo.loa.** n. A native grass (*Eragrostis variabilis*) 30 to 90 cm high, with long narrow flowering panicles, growing on open slopes and ridges. Also *kalamālō, kāwelu*.
- 'emo 'olē.** conj. Without delay, immediately, suddenly, in no time at all, quickly. (FS 11, Oih. 2.2.) (Gram. 11.1.)
- emo.wai.** n. An addition of water, as for mixing poi. *Kaua'i.*
- emu.** vt. 1. To shoo away. 2. To rid plants of weeds. *ho'ēmu.* Caus/sim. (Malo 199.)
- 'ena.** 1. nvi. Red-hot, glowing. *Fig.*, raging, angry; anger. *'Ena aloha*, intense affection or longing. *Pi'i ka 'ena*, to feel anger. *hō.'ena.* Caus/sim. (PCP *kena*; cf. Marquesan *kena.*) 2. vt. Shy; to shy. *Mai 'ena i ke kanaka i laka aku*, do not shy away from a person who is attracted [treat kindness with kindness]. 3. n. Abundance, plenty. Cf. *One-lau-'ena.* 4. n. Opening in the clouds said to be like the jaw of the *a'u* swordfish and a sign of rain. (Malo text, chapter 6, section 6.)
- 'ena.'ena.** 1. Redup. of *'ena 1, 2*; glowing, red-hot, raging. *'Ena'ena pilau*, unbearable stench. *'Ena'ena ulu o Malama i ka 'ilima* (chant), growth at Malama glowing with *'ilima* [leis]. *hō.'ena.'ena.* To cause heat, heat; to rouse to anger. *Ua hō'a'a 'ia ke ahi e ku'u inaina, a 'e 'ena'ena 'ia* (Kanl. 32.22), a fire is kindled by my anger and shall burn. (PCP *kenakena.*) 2. n. All species of cudweeds (*Gnaphalium*), members of the daisy family, small herbs having small inconspicuous flowers and more or less white woolly stems and leaves. Formerly Hawaiians stored feather standards, *kāhili*, with native species (*G. sandwicensium* and *G. hawaiiense*) to repel insects. (Neal 836.) Called *pūhehu* on Ni'ihau.
- 'ena.kō.I.** nvi. To break wind foully; such action. Probably *lit.*, flowing abundance. *E hele 'oe i ka 'enakōi*, go and break wind [a vulgar insult].
- 'ena makani.** n. 1. Stormy wind. *Mahina 'ino kēia, ke kau nei ka 'ena makani*, this is a stormy month that wind furies come. 2. Windmill. *Rare.*
- 'ena.mela.** nvs. Enamel. *Eng.*
- ene.** nvi. First attempts of an infant to move; to draw up knees and push elbows, to crawl, creep.
- 'ene.'ene.** Rare var. of *'ele'ele*, black.
- 'ene.'enemi.** Redup. of *'enemi.* *Ā 'ene'enemi ho'i i kona noho hanohano* (Nak. 30), opposing his position of honor.
- e** (verb) **nei.** Particles indicating imperfect aspect and future tense and accompanying subordinate verbs. The *nei* indicates action here or now. See Gram. 5.2.
- 'Ene.kelea, Enekerea.** n. Incarnation. *Ma ka miterio o Kou 'Enekerea Hemolele*, through the mystery of Thy Holy Incarnation.
- 'ene.kini.** n. Engine. *Eng.*
- 'ene.kinia kī.wila.** n. Civil engineer. *Eng.*
- 'enemi.** nvi. Enemy; to feel enmity; to be an enemy.
