

- hula altar to Laka. See more under *palai* (Neal 12). Also *le'ie*.
- hala pia**. n. An indigenous variety of pandanus, with keys 4 cm long, canary-yellow and small; head small, about 15 by 12 cm., used in medical prescription and for exorcising evil spirits. It was much prized for leis. *He 'ili hala pia* (Kep. 67), light-colored skin.
- hala Pola.pola**. n. A kind of pandanus. *Lit.*, Borabora [Tahitian] *hala*.
- hā.lau**. 1. n. Long house, as for canoes or hula instruction; meeting house. *Malu hālau loa*, shade of the long house; *fig.*, shade of trees. *Ā ua nui Hilo, hālau lani i ke ao* (chant), and Hilo rains so much, a heavenly shed in the clouds. (PNP *folau*.) 2. vs. Large, numerous; much. *Ka wai hālau o Wai-lua* (For. 4:163), expansive waters of Wai-lua. **ho'o.hā.lau**. To make numerous. *Ho'ohālau i ka hale a piha i nā makamaka*, fill the house full with friends.
- hala 'uha.loa**. n. Probably the same as the weed 'uhaloa, a plant form of the pig god Kama-pua'a, mentioned repeatedly in an 1851 version of the legend of Kama-pua'a.
- hala 'ula**. n. 1. Pandanus with fruit sections entirely orange-red; same size as *hala 'tkoi*. 2. A variety of pineapple similar to *hala kea*, but leaves and unripe fruit red-tinged. (HP 214.)
- Hālau-lani**. n. A star, said to be observed in the month of Hilinehu.
- hala 'ula.'ula**. Same as *hala 'ula 1, 2*.
- hā.lawa**. Same as *kālawa 1-3*.
- hā.lā.wai**. 1. nvi. Meeting; to meet. **ho'o.hā.lā.wai**. To arrange a meeting. (Kin. 27.20; Hal. 59.4.) 2. n. Horizon. *Mai ka ho'oku'i a ka hālāwai*, from zenith to horizon.
- hā lawai'a**. See *hā 6*, sinker.
- hā.lā.wai hō.'eu.'eu**. n. Rally; inspirational meeting.
- hā.lawa.lawa**. Redup. of *hālawa*.
- halawi**. To scrutinize. (And.)
- hale**. 1. nvi. House, building, institution, lodge, station, hall; to have a house. Many types of *hale* are listed below. *Ua hale mākou*, we have a house. *Hale i luna a i lalo*, a two-story house. **ho'o.hale**. To lodge in a house; to receive in a house. *E ho'ohale 'ia aku, he makamaka ola*, extend the hospitality of the house, [he is] a friend who extends appreciation. (PPN *fale*.) 2. n. Host, hospitable person. Cf. *hale aikāne*, *hale kipa*. *He hale leo 'ole aku ia*, he is a kindly hospitable friend. 3. n. Name listed by Brigham for a *pāwehe* mat pattern; there is a central large lozenge with an enclosed rectangular figure internally enhanced with red on alternate weft crossings. 4. Also *hare*. Hare. (Oihk. 11.6.)
- hale 'aha.'aina**. n. Restaurant.
- Hale 'Aha.'ō.lalo Ali'i**. n. House of Nobles.
- hale ahu.wai.wai**. n. Warehouse.
- hale ai.kāne**. n. A close family friend, house with friends.
- hale 'aina**. n. Restaurant, cafe, eating house, boarding-house; in ancient times, the eating house for women.
- hale-a-ka-i'a**. Same as *pōniu* and 'inalua, the balloon vine. *Lit.*, house of the fish, so called because the vine was used in making small fish basket traps. *Ni'ihau*.
- hale ali'i**. n. Chief's house, royal residence, palace.
- hale 'ā.mala**. n. Blacksmith shop.
- hale 'ā.pulu**. n. Shack.
- hale 'au.amo**. n. Palanquin.
- hale 'au.'au**. n. Bathhouse.
- hale 'auhau**. n. House where taxes are paid; tax building.
- hale aupuni**. n. Capitol building, government building.
- hale.haka**. n. Hollyhock (*Althaea rosea*), introduced. (Neal 552.) *Eng. Halehaka pupupu*, double form of the hollyhock.
- hale hā.lā.wai**. n. Meetinghouse, synagogue.
- hale.hale**. nvs. High, towering, as a housetop, cliff, or waves; cavernous. *Fig.*, emptiness, hunger. *Po'i halehale ka nalu*, the waves break high as a house. *Pali e halehale mai ana* (FS 21), cliffs towering up. *Halehale ke aloha* (song), deep, deep love. **ho'o.hale.hale**. Caus/sim.
- hale hana**. n. Workshop, factory.
- hale hana hao**. n. Ironworks.
- hale hana 'ili**. n. Tannery.
- hale hana pia (bia)**. n. Brewery.
- hale hana uila**. n. Powerhouse. *Lit.*, electricity-making house.
- hale hau**. n. 1. House built with posts and thatch sticks of *hau* wood and thatch tied with *hau* cord; said to be used for healing the sick. 2. Icehouse.
- hale hei.au**. n. House for keeping images and for worship; house in a heiau.
- hale ho.āhu**. n. Warehouse, storehouse, shed.
- hale ho.āhu puke**. n. Library.
- hale hō.'ai.'ō**. n. Pawnshop.
- hale hō.'ai.'ō kā.lā**. n. Credit union. *Lit.*, house for loaning money.
- hale hō.'ike.'ike**. n. Exhibition hall, museum, art academy. *Hale Hō'ike'ike o Ka-mehameha*, Bishop Museum.
- hale hō.'ike.'ike i'a**. n. Aquarium. Cf. *pahu i'a*.
- hale holo.holona**. n. Barn.
- hale ho'o.kama.kama**. n. House of prostitution, brothel.
- hale ho'o.kipa**. n. Guest house, lodging house, inn.
- hale ho'o.kolo.kolo**. n. Court house.
- hale ho'o.komo kini**. n. Cannery.
- hale ho'o.lako kaua**. n. Armory.
- hale ho'o.lēwa**. n. Funeral parlor, undertaker's establishment.
- hale ho'o.luhi**. n. House of bondage. (Puk. 13.3.)
- hale ho'o.lulu**. n. Railway depot or terminal, waiting station.
- hale ho'o.lulu kā'a**. n. Bus station or terminal.
- hale ho'o.lulu kā'a.ahi**. n. Train station or terminal.
- hale ho'o.lulu moku.lēle**. n. Airport.
- hale ho'o.lu'u**. n. Dyehouse.
- hale ho'o.lu'u 'ili**. n. Tannery.
- hale ho'o.maha**. n. Resthouse.
- hale ho'o.malu**. n. Quarantine house or station.
- hale ho'o.nā**. n. Building where land claims were adjudicated by the Board of Commissioners to Quiet Land Titles.
- hale ho'o.pono.pono**. n. Administrative building.
- hale ho'o.ulū mēa kanu**. n. Greenhouse, conservatory.
- halei**. Rare var. of *helei 1, 2*.
- hale imu**. n. Shelter for the ground oven; cookhouse.
- hale inu kī**. n. Teahouse, teashop. *Lit.*, tea- (*Eng.*) drinking house.
- hale inu kope**. n. Coffeehouse.
- hale inu lama**. n. Saloon, tavern, bar. *Lit.*, rum-drinking house.
- hale inu pia**. n. Beer parlor.
- hale ipu.kukui**. n. Lighthouse.
- hale kā'a**. n. 1. Garage, house for a vehicle. 2. Carriage, chariot (Hoik. 18.13; Puk. 14.7).
- hale kā.hiko kaua**. n. Armory.
- hale kāhu**. n. 1. House of a pastor. 2. Same as *hale kāhumu*.
- hale kā.humu**. n. Cookhouse.
- hale kā.mala**. n. Temporary shed, booth, shelter.
- hale kā.pi'o**. n. Lean-to shelter; house without walls. This name may be qualified by the terms 'alaneo, auolo, hālau, kāmala, kele, kōlea, O'ahu a Lua. (Kam. 76: 123.)
- hale kā.pi'o 'ili lā.'au**. n. Rude hut made of bent branches or uprights covered with bark. Cf. *kāpi'o*.
- hale kaua**. n. Fort, fortification; tower (Lunk. 9.51, 52).
- hale kā.wili lā.'au**. n. Pharmacy, drug store.
- hale keaka**. n. Theater.
- hale kia**. n. Portico; veranda with pillars; porch of pillars (1 Nal. 7.6).
- hale kīa'i**. n. Watchtower, tower (Lunk. 8.9).
- hale kilo**. n. Observatory.
- hale kilo hō.kū**. n. Star observatory.
- hale kinai ahi**. n. Fire station.
