

- hana.hanai.** n. Edge of a precipice or slope, brow of a hill. *Rare.*
- hana.hanauna.** Same as *hanauna*; contemporary.
- hana.hemo.** vt. To loosen, let go.
- hana.hewa.** v. To do wrong, err. Cf. *hana i ka hewa*, to commit adultery.
- hana.hihi.** vs. Rank-growing, wild, branchy. *Fig.*, untamed, uncivil, crude.
- hana.ho'o.hano.hano.** n. Ceremony, ritual.
- hana.ho'o.hiwa.hiwa.** n. Celebration to honor someone or something.
- hana.ho'o.hala.manawa.** n. Hobby, pastime.
- hana.ho'o.nanea.** n. Pleasant pastime, hobby, avocation.
- hana.hou.** vt. To do again, repeat, renew, repair, mend; encore.
- hā.nai.** 1. nvs. Foster child, adopted child; foster, adopted. *Keiki hānai*, foster child. *Lawe hānai*, to adopt a child. *Makua hānai*, foster parent. *Kāna hānai*, his adopted child. 2. nvt. To raise, rear, feed, nourish, sustain; provider, caretaker (said affectionately of chiefs by members of the court). Cf. *akua hānai*, *hanai-āhuhu*, *hanaina*. *Hānai holoholona*, to feed and care for domestic animals. *Makamaka hānai*, generous and hospitable friend. *Hānai ā momona*, to fatten. *Hānai maila 'oia iāia i ka meli* (Kanl. 32.13), he fed him the honey. (PPN *faangai*.) 3. n. Body of a *kōkō* net carrier, and cords attached to it; fish net or trap, as for 'o'opu fish; kite. 4. Same as *hanahanai*. 5. n. Hawai'i name for *mānai*, needle. 6. vi. To skim along.
- hā.nai.ā.huhu.** nvt. To make a pet of an animal; to care for well, as a pet; cherished plans, pet projects. *Eia kekahi mau hānaiāhuhu a ke aupuni*, here are some favorite plans of the government.
- hā.nai'āi.** nv. To feed, give food to; food provider.
- Hā.nai-a-ka-malama.** n. 1. The Southern Cross. 2. Name of a benevolent goddess. 3. Name of Queen Emma's residence in Nu'u-anu Valley.
- hā.nai.kahu.** n. Offering for a pastor, of Congregationalists. *Lit.*, feeding pastor.
- hana.ikaika.** nv. Hard or strenuous labor or activity; to do such.
- hā.nai.kuahu.** nv. To renew offerings on a *kuahu* altar; one who does so.
- hana'ili.** nv. Tanner; to tan.
- hanaina.** n. Feeding. *Eia mai ka moa i hanaina lā* (GP 42), here is the rooster fed in the sun [Ka-welo likens himself to a fighting cock; the cock fed in the sun was believed strong because of turning his head to avoid heat; in FS 63 and 65 the verb is *hānai 'ia i ka lā*, fed in the sun].
- hana'ino.** nvt. To mistreat, abuse, mutilate, injure, mar, treat cruelly or carelessly; cruelty; cruel, wicked; evil deed, torment. *Hana 'ino 'oe i ka lolo*, you are treating the dress carelessly.
- hana'i'o.** vs. Serious about what one does; to consummate, as a love affair. *Lit.*, to do truly. *Mai kolohe aku 'oe i kā ke ali'i, o hana'i'o mai auane'i*, don't tamper with the chief's [things], or [he] will do something drastic. *Hana'i'o ka ua iā Kohala* (song), rain really poured at Kohala.
- hā.nai.pū.** n. Title of the bearer of an image, who ate the food offered to the god.
- Hana.kahi.** n. An ancient chief of Hilo whose name was used in poetry to designate the Hilo district. See ex., *hanane'e, Kani-lehua*.
- Hana-ka'i-luna.** n. Name of a *lua* stroke.
- hana.kala.kalai.** n. Trifling, inconsequential action, as a casual love affair. *Lit.*, carving act.
- Hana-ka.lau-'ai.** n. Name of a star associated with Hana-kau-luna, and the name of a legendary place. *Lit.*, Hana, the abundant food.
- hana.kama.li'i.** vs. Childishness; childish; so easy that a child can do it.
- hana.kapahu.** n. Smallpox (perhaps short for *hana i ka pahu*, build the coffin).
- Hana-kau-luna.** n. 1. Name of a star associated with *Hana-kalau-'ai*, and *Haka-lau-'ai*; all were omens of pestilence or calamity. 2. Name of a death stroke in *lua* fighting.
- hana.keaka.** See *keaka 1*.
- hana.ki.wila.** Civil service.
- hana.kolohe.** nv. Mischief, trick; to do mischief, misbehave.
- hana.kuli.** See *kuli 2*.
- Hanale.** 1. n. Henry. *Eng.* See saying, *pulu 5*. 2. (*Not cap.*) nvi. Hungry, hunger. *Eng.*
- Hana.lei.** n. Name of a large valley on Kaua'i. *Lit.*, lei valley. See saying *kaupoku 1*. 2. (*Not cap.*) vi. Hurlled forth. *Kēia huhū hanalei 'ana*, this vented anger.
- hana.lepo.** nv. Dirty work; to do dirty work; excrement; to excrete.
- hana.lima.** nv. Handmade, manual; manual labor; to work with the hands. *Nā mea hana lima*, handicraft. *Hana lima 'ike*, skilled labor.
- hana.luhi.** nvs. Tiresome activity or work, bother, toil.
- hana.ma'a.** n. Customary or usual activity. *Mea hana ma'a*, habit.
- hana.ma'i.** nvi. Sexual intercourse; to perform such. *Lit.*, genital activity.
- hana.make.** nvt. Thing of destruction, as a weapon of sorcery; to kill, destroy; deathly.
- hana.mana.** n. Miracle, supernatural deed, witchcraft.
- hana.mau.** nvi. Customary activity; to work constantly, diligent. *Hana mau 'ia*, commonly done, usual activity. *'Ōlelo hana mau 'ia*, common word.
- hana.mua'ia.** vs. Second hand, done before.
- hanana.** n. Occasion, event, occurrence, incident, time. *I hele mai nā malihini i kēlā hanana i ka male 'ana o nā keiki*, the visitors come on that occasion of the marriage of the children.
- hā.nana.** Var. of *hālana 1*; to overflow.
- hana.nai.** Same as *nanai 1*; to strut.
- hana.ne'e.** Same as *hāne'ene'e 1*. *Hanane'e ke kīkala o kō Hilo kini; ho'i lu'ulu'u i ke one o Hanakahi*, sagging hips of Hilo's multitudes; return burdened to the sands of Hanakahi [of grief or heavy burdens].
- hana.no'eau.** n. Art. *'Ike hana no'eau*, art; artistic.
- hana.nui.** vs. Difficult, hard, laborious.
- hana.nu'u.** vs. Short, plump. *Wahine poupou pou hana-nu'u* (song), woman stout, very short and plump.
- hana'oi.** nvt. To sharpen; cutlery. See ex., *pu'u lele*.
- hana.pa'a.** 1. vt. To make secure, fasten, shut up. *Hana pa'a 'oia iā Ioane i loko o ka hale pa'ahao* (Luka 3.20), he shut up John in prison. 2. n. Steady employment.
- hana.pē.pē.** vt. To bruise, crush. (Hal. 44.19.)
- hana.pilo.** Var. of *hanopilo*.
- hana.pipi.** nv. To work with cattle, especially as a cowboy; such work.
- hana.puna.hele.** n. Favorite pastime, hobby.
- hā.nau.** 1. nvi. To give birth; to lay (an egg); born; offspring, child, childbirth; productive, fertile. *Hānau 'o Hina*, Hina gave birth. *Hānau 'ia 'o Hina*, Hina was born. *'Ili'ili hānau*, reproducing pebbles. *Welo hānau*, productive or prolific family. *He keiki hānau 'e*, premature baby. *Lā hānau*, birthday. *Hānau ka moa i ka hua*, the chicken lays an egg. **ho'o.hā.nau.** To act as midwife, deliver a baby; to reproduce. (PPN *faanau*.) 2. interj. Happy birthday (used in toasts). 3. Short for *hoahānau*, cousin. *Rare*.
- hanaua.** Rare pas/imp. of *hānau 1*. (For. 6:502.)
- hā.nau'e'epa.** nvi. Peculiar or unusual birth; born with a strange sign or mark.
- hā.nau'ēwe.** n. Premature birth.
- hā.nau.hope.** n. Younger brother or sister; the last-born.
- hā.nau.hou.** nvs. Reborn, born again, rebirth; baptism. **ho'o.hā.nau.hou.** To cause a rebirth, baptize.
- hā.nau.kahi.** n. Only child. (Sol. 4.3.)
- hā.nau.kama.** nvs. Childbearing, prolific, fertile, having many children; mother of one's children, wife. *Kāna hānau kama*, his wife.
