

kale.wai. n. Kind of light-brownish tapa.
kā.lewa.lewa. Redup. of *kālewa*.
Kale.wali, Kalēvari. n. Calvary. *Eng.* Cf. *iwi po'o*.
kali. 1. nvi. To wait, loiter, linger, tarry; loiterer; hesitant, slow. *Kali iki*, wait a moment, just a minute. *He kali ko'u waha, ā he kali ho'i ko'u elelo* (Puk. 4.10), I am slow of speech and slow of tongue. **ho'o.kali.** To cause to wait, delay; lingering, slow, as a disease. (PPN *tali*.) 2. n. Vagina.
kā.ī. n. Spine, spindle, rod; string, as used to thread things upon, as flowers for a lei, or candlenuts for a torch; long vine or runner, as of sweet potato. Cf. *kāili*. *Kālī i'a*, string of fish.
kalia. 1. Pas/imp. of *kali* 1. 2. n. A native tree (*Elaeocarpus bifidus*), with long-stemmed, ovate leaves and greenish flowers, formerly used for fire making and constructing grass houses, the bark for cordage. It belongs to the linden family. (Neal 545.) (PNP *tali(a,e)*.) 3. n. A variety of sweet potato.
kali.ali. A tree or plant used in medicine. (And.)
kā.li'i. vt. To hurl spears at a chief as he landed from a canoe, in order that he might exhibit his dexterity and courage in dodging them, almost a ritual.
kalika. n. 1. Silk. *Eng.* 2. Mulberry. 3. A variety of sweet potato. The name may be qualified by *lau ke'oke'o*, white-leafed, and *'ula'ula*, red.
kā.lika, galika. n. Garlic. (Nah. 11.5.) *Eng.* See more common *'aka'akai pūpū*.
kali.kali. Redup. of *kali* 1. Cf. *pākalikali*. (PPN *talitali*.)
Kalika.maka. Same as *Kalīkimaka*.
kā.liki. nvt. Corset, girdle, tight waist binder, suspenders; to tie, as a corset. (*kā-2 + liki*, to tighten.) See ex., *pū'ali 2. Kāliki i pa'a ka pā'ele i ka wa'a* (For. 5:637), so the black paint will adhere to the canoe.
Kaliki.ano, Kristiano. nvs. Christian. (Probably Gr. *Christianos*.)
Kaliki.maka, Karīkimaka. nvs. Christmas. *Eng.* *Mele Kalīkimaka*, Merry Christmas.
kā.liki wai.ū. n. Brassiere, corset cover. *Lit.*, breast corset.
kaliko. 1. n. A wild, weedy euphorbia, or wild spurge (*Euphorbia heterophylla* var. *cyathophora*), a tropical American herb about 30 cm high, with green, oval leaves, but with floral leaves white or pink at the base; used medicinally as a purgative. (Neal 516.) 2. See *hūpō kaliko*.
kaliko.lehua. n. A slow-growing sweet potato. (Kam. 76:27.)
kali.kone, karitone. n. Cretonne. *Eng.*
Kali.laia, Galilaia. n. Galilee. (Gr. *Galilaia*.)
kalili. Same as *nani Wai-'ale'ale*.
kā.lilo. vi. Dying, at death's door; to lie hovering between life and death. (*kā-2 + lilo*, lost.) **ho'o.kā.lilo.** To cause death; to have the appearance of death.
kā.lilo.lilo. Redup. of *kā.lilo*. Also *kāninonino*. *Kāli lolilo ho'i kēlā 'ano hānau 'ana*, at that kind of birth, life hangs in the balance. **ho'o.kā.lilo.lilo.** Caus/sim.
kalima. n. Cream. *Eng.*
kalima.hamo. n. Face cream.
kalima.wai.ū. n. Cream.
Ka-limu-kā-kanaka-o-Mahu.moku. n. A *lua* fighting stroke, named for a *limu* associated with Hanalei, Kaua'i (see *limu-kā-kanaka*). (Also without *Ka-*.)
kalina. n. A waiting. See *kali* 1.
kā.lina. n. 1. Long vine, as of sweet potato. 2. Sardine. *Eng.* *Rare*.
kalio. n. A gusty breeze, perhaps a proper name. (Ii 150.)
kalio.nēke, kalionete. n. Clarinet. *Eng.*
kalipa. n. 1. Caliph. *Eng.* 2. Also *garipa*. Grippe. *Eng.*
kali.palaoa. n. Cauliflower (*Brassica oleracea* var. *botrytis*). Same as *kāpiki pua*, the common name. *Eng.*
Kalisto, Karisto, Kristo. n. Christ. (Gr. *Christos*.)
kalo. 1. n. Taro (*Colocasia esculenta*), a kind of aroid cultivated since ancient times for food, spreading widely from the tropics of the Old World. In Hawai'i, taro has been the staple from earliest times to the present, and here its culture developed greatly, including more

than 300 forms. All parts of the plant are eaten, its starchy root principally as poi, and its leaves as *lū'au*. It is a perennial herb consisting of a cluster of long-stemmed, heart-shaped leaves rising 30 cm. or more from underground tubers or corms. (Neal 157-60.) Specifically, *kalo* is the name of the first taro growing from the planted stalk; names of generations as listed for Hawai'i Island (Kep. 153) are (1) *kalo*: see ex., *palili*, (2) *'ohā* or *mu'u*, (3) *'a'ae* or *'ae*, (4) *'ōnihinihi*, (5) *kokole*, (6) *pahūpahū*. *Kō mākou kalo kanu o ka 'āina* (saying), our planted taro of the land [proud and affectionate reference to a chief]. (PPN *talo*.) 2. Same as *kalokalo*. (PPN *talo*.)
kā.loa. n. 1. Oval wooden dish or platter. 2. (*Cap.*) Names of three nights of the month; see below. These nights were sacred to the god Kanaloa. *Kapu Kāloa* (Malo 35), monthly taboo nights of *'Ole Pau* and *Kāloa Kū Kahi*.
Kā.loa Kū Kahi. n. Twenty-fourth day of the Hawaiian month. *Lit.*, *Kāloa* standing first.
Kā.loa Kū Lua. n. Twenty-fifth day of the Hawaiian month. *Lit.*, *Kāloa* standing second.
Kā.loa Pau. n. Twenty-sixth day of the Hawaiian month. *Lit.*, last *Kāloa*.
kalohe. *Rare* var. of *kolohe*.
kalohi. n. Male sex organ. *Rare*.
kalo kala.koa. n. Caladium (*Caladium bicolor*), a tropical American herb, an aroid grown in gardens for the many color forms of its heart-shaped leaves. (Neal 160-1.) *Lit.*, calico taro.
kalo.kalo. nvi. Conversational prayer (informal appeal and not a memorized prayer or chant); to pray thus. (PPN *talotalo*.)
kalo.kalo leo. n. Best wishes. *Nā kalokalo leo 'ana no ke ola*, best wishes for health.
kā.loke. n. Carrot (*Daucus carota*). (Neal 660-1.) *Eng.*
kā.lolē. 1. vs. Straight, of hair. 2. n. Masseur, masseuse. (These services were usually performed by one of the opposite sex.) *Rare*. 3. n. Ne'er-do-well, vagabond, one who could not support a wife and hence did not marry. (Malo 201.) 4. vi. To change, as the voice. *Rare*. Cf. *lōle*, to unfold.
kalo.līnē, kalorīnē. n. Chlorine. *Eng.*
kā.lolo. n. First liquor that runs off in distillation.
Ka-loloa-māi.au. n. A *lua* fighting stroke. *Lit.*, neat length. (Also without *Ka-*.)
kalo.mēla. Calomel. *Eng.*
kā.lona. n. 1. Old horse, old plug, slowpoke. 2. (*Cap.*) Sharon. *Eng.* *Ka loke o Kālona*, the rose of Sharon.
kalo pa'a. n. Cooked unpounded taro. *Loa'a 'oe i ke kalo pa'a* (saying), you got hit by solid taro [i.e., you received a terrible blow].
kalo Pā.kā. Same as *'ili uaua*, a taro.
kā.lua. 1. vt. To bake in the ground oven; to burn brick or lime; baked. (*kā-*, causative + *lua*, pit). 2. vs. Double, two-stranded. 3. Same as *kālualua*. 4. n. Sinkhole, pit. *Rare*.
kā.lua.lua. Same as *'ālualua*, bumpy.
Ka-lua-o-ka-'ohē. n. Name of a star. *Lit.*, the pit of the bamboo.
Ka.lua-oka.oka. n. Name of a star. *Lit.*, the pit of dregs.
kā.lua pa'a. vt. To bake whole, as a pig. *Kālua pa'a 'ia 'oe e māua i ka imu* (Nak. 67), the two of us will bake you whole in the oven.
Ka-lu'ē.lu'ē. n. A *lua* fighting stroke. (Also without *Ka-*.)
kalu.hā. n. 1. Papyrus (*Cyperus papyrus*), a large African sedge, growing in water. (Neal 183-4.) 2. Some other large sedges (as species of *Scirpus*), if growing in water. 3. Name of a fish (no data).
kā.luhā.luhā. nvs. Of the sedge family; sedge.
kā.luhe. vs. To droop, bend, vibrate as a leaf in the wind; to ogle, bend and twist, as a coquettish woman; to act the coquette. Cf. *luhe*, to droop. **ho'o.kā.luhe.** To pretend to droop, flirt, etc.; to cause drooping.
kalu.heā. vs. Fragrant.
