

- kolohala uliuli i 'ō'a 'ia me ke ke'oke'o*, a dark pheasant feather lei mixed with white. *He Hawai'i 'oia akā ua 'ō'a 'ia me ke koko Pākē*, he's Hawaiian, but there is a little strain of Chinese also. **ho'ō.ā**. To mix.
- 'ō.a'a, 'ō.'a'a'a, 'ō.a'a.'a'a**. Somewhat fibrous. Cf. 'a'a'a.
- 'ō.ahe.ahe**. To blow gently, as a breeze. Cf. *aheae*.
- 'ō.ahi**. n. 1. Rocket, fireworks; clot of burning lava, as from an eruption; hurling firebrands, as from a cliff for ancient Kaua'i spectacle; flashing lightning. *Lit.*, projecting fire. See ex., *kīhe'ahe'a. Nā pali 'ōahi o Makana*, the cliffs of Makana, where fire was hurled forth. 2. Rough stone or pumice, as used for polishing surfboards or bowls, or for scraping bristles of a pig (a specimen in the Bishop Museum was made of coral).
- O'ahu**. n. Name of the most populous of the Hawaiian Islands and the seat of Honolulu. The name has no meaning (see Pukui, Elbert, and Mookini, 1975, 262). See saying *kau po'ohiwi*, and epithets, *O'ahu* (English-Hawaiian).
- 'ōai, 'ōwai**. 1. vt. To entwine, twine; to stir round and round, as a liquid; to go round and round. **hō.'ōai**. To cause to entwine; to twist, entwine. 2. n. Bubo, swelling. *Rare*. 3. n. Porous stone, as used for polishing canoes and calabashes. *Rare*.
- 'o ai**. Var. spelling of 'owai: see *wai*, who.
- 'ōai.kū, 'ōwai.kū**. n. Gasping for breath, as during an attack of asthma; shortness of breath accompanied by a churning, heaving motion as by one attempting to breathe. *Kai pili 'ōaikū* (Kep. 183), a churning, gasping sea.
- 'ōai.'ōai**. Redup. of 'ōai 1.
- 'ōaka, 'ōwaka**. 1. Same as *hoaka* 5, to open. '*Oaka a'ela kona waha, a'o maila 'oia iā lākou* (Mat. 5.2), he opened his mouth instantly and taught them. **hō.'ōaka**. Caus/sim. 2. vi. To sprout, as sweet potatoes. *Waiho ā 'owaka like ka ulu o ka lau 'uala*, left until the sweet potato leaves all grow and sprout. 3. Var. spelling of 'owaka, to flash.
- 'ōa.kaaka, 'ōwa.kaaka, 'ōwaka.waka**. Redup. of 'ōaka 1.
- 'ōā.ki'i.ala, 'ōwā.ki'i.ala**. n. A stroke in *lua* fighting.
- oala**. A kind of fish. (And.)
- 'oala**. Var. spelling of 'owala.
- 'ōā.laala, 'ōwā.lala**. nvi. Rising of the wind; to rise, as wind; to occur, as a thought. Cf. *-alaala. He 'ōālaala makani iki nō* (Kep. 103), a slight rise of the wind.
- 'ō.ali, 'ō.wali**. 1. n. Cretan brake, a fern (*Pteris cretica*), widely distributed in warm parts of the world, growing wild in Hawai'i. Long-stemmed, ovate fronds rise about 60 cm from creeping underground stems, and each frond has four to six pairs of long narrow divisions. (Neal 17.) 2. Var. spelling of 'ōwali 1.
- 'ōā.li'i, 'ōwā.li'i**. n. Maidenhair spleenwort, a fern (*Asplenium trichomanes*) found on high mountains of Hawai'i and also present in many temperate regions of the world. Wiry-stemmed, narrow fronds grow in dense tufts 10 to 30 cm high, the fronds consisting of numerous small, round divisions on two sides of the stem.
- 'ōā.li'i maka.li'i**. n. A native fern (*Schizaea robusta*). Called *haili-o-Pua* on Hawai'i.
- oalu**. n. A variety of taro. (HP 34.)
- oalu nui**. n. A variety of taro. (HP 34.)
- 'oama, 'owama**. n. Young of the *weke*, goatfish. (PCP *koama*.)
- o'a moku**. n. Ship's spar.
- 'ō.ana, 'ō.wana**. n. Small taro peeled, wrapped in ti leaves, and baked in the ground oven.
- 'ō.ani.ani**. nvi. Very slight stir of air, a breeze; to blow slightly. Cf. *ani. He kai mehana no ke 'ōaniani makani 'ole* (Kep. 101), it is a very warm sea where there is no breeze stirring.
- oa.oa**. Same as *ohaoha*. (AP.)
- 'ōā.'ōā, 'ōwā.'ōwā**. 1. Redup. of 'ōā. 2. A variety of taro.
- 'ō.ā.'ō.ā**. Same as 'olā'olā, to gurgle. (And.)
- 'ōā.'ōaka**. 1. Redup. of 'ōaka. 2. Var. spelling of 'owa'owaka 1.
- 'oala**. Var. spelling of 'owala.
- 'ōā.'oala**. Var. spelling of 'owā'owala.
- o'a pē'a**. n. Spar for a sail.
- o'a pō.kole**. n. Ledger line in music.
- 'oau, 'owau**. 1. n. O'ahu and Maui name for a freshwater 'o'opu fish (*Eleotris sandwicensis*) called 'ōkuhe elsewhere. See 'ōkuhe for other names. The name 'oau is said to be so called because of a tale: a fisherman caught a lot of these fish, but they disappeared; the fisherman called for them and a voice answered "'o au, 'o au'" (it's me, it's me) and the fish turned into lizards and scampered off. 2. nvi. A cat, so called because of its cry: to mew. *Mikimiki mai ka 'owau lā, no ka hemahema o ia ala* (song of the 1880s), the cat is on the alert, when someone is careless. 3. n. A variety of taro. 4. n. A moss.
- 'o au, 'o wau**. See *au* 14.
- 'ō.au.au**. vi. To go faster. See *au* 3. *He 'ōālaala makani, he 'ōauau* (Kep. 103), it's a rising wind, one blowing faster.
- 'ōā.ulu.niu**. n. A variety of taro (no data).
- 'oawa**. Var. spelling of 'ōawaawa and 'owāwa, valley.
- oe**. nv. Prolonged sound or thing; sound of chanting, vibration, whistle of a train; whistling of a bull-roarer; drawn out wail of an infant; long, prolonged. *Fig.*, to assume a superior air. (Preceded by *ke*.) *Nānā aku 'oe, ke kākulu maila ke oe*, look, acting superior there.
- 'oe**. 1. idiom. Resembling, like. *Ke pinana kēlā keiki i ke kumulā'au, 'oia nō 'oe 'o ke keko*, when that child climbs the tree, he's just like a monkey. '*Oia nō 'oe 'o ke kaimana*, just like a diamond. *He nuku moi 'oe*, like a moi [fish] beak. 2. pronoun. You (singular), thou. (Gram. 8.2.) '*Oe pono'i, 'oe iho*, you yourself. (PPN *koe*.) 3. idiom. Much, indeed (sometimes following *nō* or connecting enumerations). *Ua nui ka mea 'ai, 'o ka pua'a 'oe, 'o ka lū'au 'oe, 'o ka limu 'oe*, there was much food, pork, taro greens, and seaweed. *I laila nō 'oe, pau ka hoihoi*, no more fun there at all.
- 'ōē**. Var. spelling of 'owē.
- 'o'ē**. nvt. To probe upward, prod, pry, prick, jab, poke, gore; sharp darting pain; jagged, spiked. See ex., 'owala. **hō.'o'ē**. To probe, prick, jab, etc.
- Oea**. n. Star name (no data). (Kuhelani.)
- 'oe.ha'a**. nvi. Crooked, distorted, deformed; to walk in an ungainly manner, swaying the shoulders; to waddle. *Fig.*, deceitful; trick. Cf. '*ōpae 'oeha'a. hō.'oe.ha'a*. To cause to walk in a crooked way or be crooked; to pretend such.
- 'ō.ehe.ehe**. Var. spelling of 'ōwehewehe.
- 'oehu, 'owehu**. vt. To romp, gambol, prance, leap; blustery, gusty, as a storm or angry person; to head straight for, as a canoe. Cf. *ho'ēhu*.
- 'oehu.ēhu**. Redup. of 'oehu. Cf. *ehuehu. He aha kēia 'oehuehu nei, pi'i 'ōkala o ka hulu* (song), what is this disturbance, this bristling of the fur?
- 'oēke**. Var. spelling of 'oweke.
- 'oene, 'owene**. n. 1. Mesh size between one and two fingers. 2. Last taro taken from a crop; small-sized taro.
- 'o'eno**. n. Twill plaiting, as in hats, mats. Cf. '*ahu 'o'eno, ho'ohewahewa*.
- oe.oe**. 1. Redup. of *oe*; whistle, as of steamer or train, siren; bull-roarer, as made of *kamani* seed or coconut shell on a long string; long, tall, tapering, towering; a long object, pillar (preceded by *ke*). *Pe'a oeo*, a long sail. *Kani oeo ke oeo*, the bull-roarer whistles. **hō.'ōe.oe**. To stretch out, as the neck; to reach high; to prolong, as a sound; to toll; to yodel. *Uwē ho'ōeoe*, prolonged wailing. 2. Same as *lupe'akeke*, a bird. 3. n. Temporary booth occupied by priests during taboo days of a heiau. (Malo 163.)
- 'oe.'oe**. Young stage of the *kawakawa*, bonito.
- 'o'e.'o'e**. Redup. of 'o'e. *I ho'i iho au e moe, 'o'e'o'e ana kō ia lā kuli* (song), I went back to sleep, but his knees
