

- mua*. 3. n. Garden balsam or impatiens (*Impatiens balsamina*), from southeastern Africa, an annual to about 90 cm tall, grown ornamentally for its pink, red, yellow, white, or spotted flowers. (Neal 539-40.)
- 'ō. **lepe kupe**. n. Bivalve, possibly *Codakia punctata* and *Ctena bella*. Cf. *kupe*, 'ōkupe.
- 'ō. **lepe.lepe**. Redup. of 'ōlepe 1; shutters, Venetian blinds, lattice work (Mele 2.9); diaphragm between chest and stomach (rare). See *hula 'ōlepelepe*.
- ho.'ō. **lepe.lepe**. Redup. of ho'ōlepe.
- 'ō. **lepe maka.loa**. n. A kind of 'ōlepe 2 (*Martesia striata*); also *makaloa*.
- 'ō. **lepe nui**. n. Any large bivalve, *Tridacna*.
- 'ō. **lepe pā.paua**. n. A kind of 'ōlepe 2 (*Barbatia (Acar) divaricata*). See *pāpaua*.
- 'ō. **lepe pū**. vt. To overturn completely. Cf. 'ōlepe. 'ōlepe pū 'ia kaupoku e ka makani, the roofs were ripped off by the wind.
- 'ō. **lepe waha nui**. n. A rock borer (*Gastrochaena cuneiformis*). Lit., big-mouthed 'ōlepe.
- 'ō. **lepo**. Rare var. of 'ōlepelepe.
- 'ō. **lepo.lepo**. vs. Somewhat dirty, murky, sullied; to sully. Fig., to offend. *A kāhiko noho'i nā maka'āinana i 'ole e 'ōlepelepe nā maka o ke ali'i ke nānā mai* (Kep. 165), the commoners were dressed up so as not to offend the eyes of the chiefs who might look upon them. 'ōlepelepe ka 'ōpū, the stomach is out of order, needs cleansing.
- 'ō. **le.pū**. vt. To discard. *E 'olepū ana i nā mea kūpono 'ole o kēia mo'olelo*, discarding all that is valueless in this story.
- 'ō. **lewa**. vs. Swinging. Fig., fickle, changeable, not firmly established or fixed, variable.
- 'ō. **wale!** nvi. Not at all! Of no interest, value, use. 'O 'ole wale mā! Those nobodies! *He 'ole wale*, nothing doing.
- 'ō. **lewa.lewa**. Redup. of 'ōlewa. Fig., hungry.
- oli. nvt. Chant that was not danced to, especially with prolonged phrases chanted in one breath, often with a trill ('i'i) at the end of each phrase; to chant thus. *Ke oli*, the chant. *Mea oli*, chanter. (PNP *oli*.)
- 'oli. nvs. Joy, happiness, pleasure; happy, joyful, gay. Cf. *hau'oli*. *Wai-'oli* (place name), happy water.
- hō.'oli. To give joy, make happy. (PEP *koli*.)
- 'oli. **ana**. 1. n. A common ornamental shrub (*Nerium oleander* and var. *indicum*), native from south Europe to Japan. Its flowers may be single or double, white, pink, or red. (Neal 695.) Eng. Also 'oliwa. 2. n. A variety of sugar cane, like lahaina in type of growth and color, but the pith dark-brown and the leaf sheath covered with red-brown hairs. (Eng., Oriental.) Also 'oleana. 3. interj. Let me see! Show me! Also *aliana*, *inane*, 'oia ana.
- 'olia. **paha**. Same as 'oia paha, maybe so. Rare.
- 'ō. **liha.liha**. vs. Somewhat liliha.
- 'oliko. vs. Shiny, sparkling, bright. *Ka ua 'oliko i ka lani*, the rain sparkling in the sky.
- 'ō. **liko**. 1. vi. To bud. Cf. *liko*. 2. n. A small tree, possibly *Rapanea helleri*, *Myrsine hosakae* (syn. *M. angustifolia*, *Suttonia angustifolia*), a kind of *kōlea*.
- 'ō. **liko.liko**. Redup. of 'ōliko 1.
- 'ō. **lile.lile**. vs. Somewhat lile.
- 'olili. vs. Shiny, sparkling, shimmering, as moonlight. Cf. *hulili*.
- 'ō. **lili**. vs. Withered, stunted, poor, as fruit. Cf. more common *mālii*.
- 'oli. **liko**. Redup. of 'oliko and 'ōliko 1; shimmering. *Ka 'oliliko wai a ka ua*, liquid sparkling of the rain.
- 'ō. **lima**. n. Arm vaccination. Lit., arm piercing.
- 'olina. vs. To make merry; joyous, rejoicing, merry-making.
- 'olina. **kio, orinatio**. n. Ordination. Eng.
- 'ō. **lino**. 1. nvs. Bright, brilliant, dazzling, gleaming; brightness, glare. *He 'ōlino aloha kēia iā'oe ē* (chant of Hi'iaka), this is a bright ray of love for you. 2. vs. Parched, dry.
- 'ō. **lino.lino**. Redup. of 'ōlino 1, 2; shining, radiant. (2 Sam. 22.13.) *E lilo nō ka lepo 'ōlinolino i wai 'au'au* (Isa. 35.7), the parched ground shall become a bathing pool.
- oli. **oli**. Redup. of *oli*; chanter. *Kau akula 'o Hale-mano i kēia kau olioli* (FS 277), Hale-mano then sang this chanting song. (PNP *olioli*.)
- 'oli.'oli. Redup. of 'oli; delight, enjoyment. See ex., *malakia. hō.'oli.'oli*. Caus/sim. (PNP *kolikoli*.)
- 'ō. **li'o.li'o**. vs. Somewhat *li'oli'o*, dazzling.
- 'oli. **ona, Oriona**. n. Orion. (Ioba 9.9.) Eng.
- 'ō. **li'u.li'u**. vs. 1. Blurred, indistinct. Cf. *kōli'uli'u, li'ua*. 'ōli'uli'u ke ala e ma'awe nei (KL line 496), indistinct the path tread here. 2. Brackish.
- 'oliwa, **oliva**. n. 1. The olive tree (*Olea europaea*), from the Mediterranean region, a small tree grown only ornamentally in Hawai'i, where it rarely flowers or yields fruit. (Neal 677-8.) Eng. See *lau 'oliwa*. Called 'oliwa haole on Ni'ihau. 2. Same as 'oliana, oleander.
- 'oliwa **kū kaha.kai**. n. Air plant (*Kalanchoe pinnata*, also *Bryophyllum pinnatum*), a succulent growing wild and cultivated in Hawai'i and other tropical countries. New plants develop along the edges of the thick scalloped leaves. The tubular green and red flowers hang lantern-like. The Hawaiian name was given because the first plants seen in Hawai'i grew near the beach. (Neal 376-8.) Lit., beach-standing olive.
- olo. 1. nvi. To rub back and forth, grate, saw; a saw (also *pahi olo*). Cf. *hale olo papa*. (PPN *holo*.) 2. vi. To resound, sound long. Cf. *olo 'awa, olo pihe*. *Olo ke kani o ka pila*, the instruments sounded together. *Ua olo pawa ke kani nei ka moa*, the dawn sounds are here, the cocks crow. (PPN *olo*.) 3. n. Long surfboard, as of *wiliwili* wood. (Laie 449.) 4. n. Hill (rare now except in place names, as *Olo-ku'i*, tall hill; *Olo-mana*, divided hill; *Olo-walu*, many hills). (PPN *olo*.) 5. n. Shelf. Rare. Cf. *olo'ewa, olohaka*. 6. n. Large foreign glass beads, said to be so called from a Hawaiian name given to the British ship, Queen Charlotte Mary, which came in 1786 under the command of Captain Dixon; this ship is said to have introduced the beads. Rare.
- 'olo. 1. n. Long gourd container used as a receptacle, as for kava or water; long body of a gourd used as a hula drum (cf. *heke, ipu*). Cf. 'olo 'awa. 2. nvi. Double chin, sagging skin, jowls, calf of leg; scrotum; wattles of a turkey; fat part under the jaws of an eel; pendant; pendulous; to roll with fat; to sag, hang down.
- 'olo-. See 'olomeka, 'olomene.
- 'oloa. 1. Same as *ma'aloa, ma'oloa*, a shrub. 2. nvt. Fine white tapa, said to have been placed over an image during prayers (Laie 467); perhaps a verb to make 'oloa tapa (For. 6:444). (PPN *koloa*.) 3. n. Gift to a child at birth.
- olo'a. n. Reported as a bird name (no data).
- 'olo.'ā. vi. Splashing on rocks, as a rough sea.
- olo. **alu**. Var. spelling of *olowalu*.
- olo 'awa. n. An address to a deity accompanied by an oblation of kava.
- 'olo 'awa. n. Coconut shell cut lengthwise as a cup for kava.
- olo.'ewa. n. Shelf.
- olo. **haka**. n. Shelf.
- 'olo. **haka**. nvs. Empty, sunken, hollow, as eyes or cheeks; emptiness, deficiency, deficit. *Po'o 'olohaka*, numskull, empty head, dunce. *He pū mai'a, he 'olohaka o loko*, a banana tree, hollow inside [said of one lacking strength]. *Ka 'olohaka o ka waihona*, deficit in the treasury.
- olo. **hana**. Rare var. of 'olohani.
- 'olo. **hani**. nvi. To strike, quit work; mutiny, riot (said to be from Eng. "all hands"). hō.'olo. **hani**. To cause or foment a strike or mutiny.
- olo. **hao**. n. Cannon. Lit., iron noise. Rare.
- 'ō. **lohe**. 1. vs. Bare, naked, barren; hairless, as a dog; bald; destitute, needy. *Ka lua 'ōlohe o ke ālialia*, the barren pit of the salt marsh. hō.'ō. **lohe**. Caus/sim. 2.
