

- 'oia paha. See 'oia.
- 'oi.hana. 1. nvs. Occupation, trade, job, employment, position, career, service (as religious or military), ministry, rite, industry, business, bureau, customs, activities, department, agency, office; Biblical book of Acts; professional. *Noho 'oihana*, office or job holder; to stay in an office or job. 'Oihana mahi 'ai, agricultural industry. 'Oihana mākaukau loa, speciality. *Ma o ka 'oihana*, ex officio. 'Ike pili 'oihana, professional knowledge. 'Oihana 'oko'a o nā hua 'ōlelo, function of words. 2. n. Tools, utensils. (Puk. 38.3.)
- 'oi.hana ali'i. n. 1. Duty or office of chief or king. 2. (Cap.) Book of Chronicles (Old Testament).
- 'oi.hana hana kā.lā (dala). n. Mint. *Lit.*, moneymaking department.
- 'oi.hana hana lima. n. Trade.
- 'oi.hana hemo.lēle. n. Clergy. *Lit.*, pure profession.
- 'oi.hana ho'o.nā'au.ao. n. 1. Educational system, profession. 2. (Cap.) Department of Instruction.
- 'oi.hana hui malū. n. Society of Masons.
- 'oi.hana kahuna. n. 1. Priesthood, office and duties of a priest, minister, or sorcerer. 2. (Cap.) Book of Leviticus in the Old Testament.
- 'oi.hana kā.kau kopē. n. Registration office. *Lit.*, copyrighting office.
- 'oi.hana kā.lā, 'oi.hana 'imi kā.lā. n. Finance.
- 'oi.hana kā.lai.'āina. n. Department of Interior, in the days of the monarchy.
- 'oi.hana kā.lepa. n. Commerce, mercantile profession.
- 'oi.hana kā.nā.wai. n. Judicial department.
- 'oi.hana kinai ahi. n. Fire department; job of putting out fires. *Lit.*, fire-extinguishing job or department.
- 'oi.hana kiu. n. Secret service, department of secret police.
- 'oi.hana koa. n. Military service.
- 'oi.hana kū.'ai 'āina. n. Real estate business.
- 'oi.hana leka. n. Postal department.
- 'oi.hana miki.'ala. n. Manufacturing. *Rare*.
- 'oi.hana moku.lēle. n. Aviation.
- 'oi.hana wai. n. 1. Water works. 2. (Cap.) Department (or Board) of Water Supply.
- 'oi ho'i hā. Same as 'oia ho'i hā.
- 'ō.iho.iho. vi. To go downwards, as deep sweet potatoes. (For. 6:125.)
- 'ō.iki. vs. Somewhat small, narrow.
- 'ō.ikiiki. vs. Somewhat hot, warm. Cf. ikiiki.
- oi.kū. vi. To heave the shoulders, as during an attack of asthma; to wallow, strain; spasm of pain. *Eia Hawai'i nui o Keawe, ke oikū nei me ka 'eha'eha* (chant for Kapi'o-lani), here is great Hawai'i of Keawe, heaving spasms of pain.
- 'o'i.lepa. Short for 'ō'ili lepa, a fish.
- 'ō.'ili. 1. nvi. To appear, come into view; appearance. 'Ō'ili ka maka, to come up, as seeds, bulbs; to sprout. See ex., *pulelo*. 2. n. Heart (of emotions). *Ku'u 'ō'ili ke lele wale nei* (For. 5:307), my heart throbs with strong emotions. 'Apo'apo a'ela kona 'ō'ili (Mat. 2.3), troubled, agitated. 3. n. Filefish, including *Cantherhines dumerili*; see below. (PEP kookili.)
- 'ō.'ili.'ili. Redup. of 'ō'ili; appearing here and there, once or successively. *Ua 'ō'ili'ili* (Kep. 184), rain that comes and goes. (PCP kookilikili.)
- 'ō.'ili lepa. n. Squartail filefish (*Cantherhines sandwichiensis*); black with reddish-yellow fins. *Lit.*, flag appearing, so called because of top fin.
- 'ō.'ili lua. vs. Prominent, conspicuous, clearly seen. 'Ō'ili lua kēla hale e kū maila i ka pu'u, that house on the hill is very conspicuous.
- 'ō.'ili oe.oe. Said to be same as 'ō'ili 'uwī'uwī. *Lit.*, long-necked 'ō'ili.
- 'ō.'ili 'uwī.'uwī. n. Fantail filefish (*Pervagor spilosoma*); yellow with black dots on its body, a diagonal stripe on head; the tail is orange; this fish is seldom seen but occasionally appears in great numbers and by some is considered an omen of the future death of royalty; sometimes they are washed ashore; seldom eaten but sometimes the dried fish are used for fuel. *Lit.*, squealing 'ō'ili, so called because of the noise it makes.
- 'ō.'ili wale. vi. To appear for no apparent reason, especially of premature birth.
- 'ō.ilo. 1. nvi. Seedling; to germinate, sprout. 2. n. Young, as of 'ō'io or of eel. (PEP koo'ilo.)
- 'oi lua. vs. Two-edged, as a dagger.
- oio. Name given for a section of a canoe rim, pronunciation unknown. (For. 5:612-3.)
- 'oio. Rare var. of *noio*, a tern.
- 'oio. hō.'oio. To show off, boast; to assume an air of superiority, as a child who cuts capers; conceited; affectation, conceit. Cf. 'oi. *Hō'oio le'a*, to show off with delight.
- 'oi'o. n. Procession of ghosts of a departed chief and his company. More commonly called *huaka'i pō*.
- 'ō.'io. n. 1. Ladyfish, bonefish (*Albula vulpes*). Stages of growth are: *pua 'ō'io*, finger length; 'amo'omo'o, forearm length; 'ō'io, adult, 60 to 90 cm long. See ex., *halalē*. 2. Soft jelly-like coconut flesh, so called perhaps because of its resemblance to mashed 'ō'io. 3. Kind of braid or plaiting, as in hat bands, so called because it was thought to resemble the backbone of the 'ō'io. 4. Stone used for polishing and as octopus lure. 5. Long bundle of salt or fish. (And.)
- 'ō.'io. n. Fork (Puk. 38.3), flesh hook.
- oi.oi. Redup. of *oi i*; to squirm.
- o'i.o'i. vi. To rest. (For. 5:499.) Cf. *o'io'ina*. (PPN *okioki*.)
- 'oi.'oi. 1. Redup. of 'oi 2; superior; a superior person. *He 'oi'oi nō Maui Hikina* (FS 299), East Maui is prominent indeed [said of a superior thing, as of feminine beauty]. hō.'oi.'oi. To show off, act superior or aggressive, flaunt; pretentious, obtrusive; upstart. *Hō'o'i'oi 'ole*, unobtrusive, modest. *Hahaki i ke kāmāwai me ka hō'o'i'oi mai*, blatant law breaker. (PPN *kohikohi*.) 2. nvi. Full of sharp points, pointed, sharp; thorn; to protrude, stick or jut out. *Pā lā'au 'oi'oi* (Mika 7.4), thorn hedge. hō.'oi.'oi. To sharpen, make sharp points. (PCP *koikoi*.)
- 'o'i.'o'i. Redup. of 'o'i, to limp.
- oi.oi.kū. Redup. of *oikū*.
- 'oi.'o'ina. n. Point, peak, cape, promontory, headland.
- o'i.o'ina. nv. Resting place for travelers, such as a shady tree, rock (PH 20); to rest. *Kahi o'io'ina* (Kin. 42.27), inn.
- 'ō.'io.'io. vi. To chitchat, chirp. Cf. 'io'io.
- 'oi'ole'a. hō.'oi'ole'a. Conceit; to show off.
- 'ō.iwi. 1. nvs. Native, native son. Cf. *iwi*, bone; *kulāiwi*. *Hui 'ōiwi*, society of native sons. hō.'ō.iwi. To pass oneself off as a native son; like a native son. (PCP *kooiwi*.) 2. nvi. Physique, appearance; to appear. *Lamalama ka 'ōiwi*, a physique glowing with health. *Maika'i ho'i kō ia ala 'ōiwi kino*, he certainly has a fine physique. *Nani ka 'ōiwi o Hilo i ka lehua* (chant, For. 5:305), Hilo appears beautiful with *lehua*. 3. n. Self; own. See ex., *pūpū* 5.
- oka. 1. n. Dregs, crumbs, sediment, hulls, grounds, small bits or pieces. Also 'āoka. 2. Var. of *kumuoka*, net.
- 'oka. n. 1. Oak. *Eng.* 2. Also *ota*. Oats. *Eng.* 3. See 'oka *kilika*.
- 'ō.kā. 1. vs. Overcome by emotion, as fear; speechless with emotion. *Fig.*, destroyed (*rare*). 2. vt. To set a decoy. *Rare*.
- 'ō.kā'a. nvi. To revolve, spin; to roll, as a mat; a top; a roll; a dry coconut whose meat has detached itself so as to make a rattling sound. 'Ōka'a lau hala, roll of pandanus leaves.
- o kā'ē. Same as *o kana* (always used with 'a'ole).
- 'ō.kai. Same as 'ōkaikai. *Ka 'ōkai makani* (For. 4:591), the rough wind.
- 'ō.kā'i. 1. n. Large night moth. See ex., 'āolo. 2. nvi. Tendrils of a plant; to grow, interlock, interweave, as tendrils. Cf. *wili'ōka'i*. 3. Same as *ka'i*, procession. See
