

- ex., 'e'a 1. 4. n. Blossom container of bananas. Cf. 'e'a 2. 5. n. Cords on the mouth of a fish net, as for *iheihe* fish. 6. Small oblong net connecting two larger fish nets. (AP.)
- 'ō.kai.kai. nvs. Rough, as the sea; angry, bad-tempered; rough seas (sometimes preceded by *ke*). *Ka lua o nā lā 'ōkaikai* (Kep. 105), second of the days with rough sea. *Ke mau ala nō ke 'ōkaikai ma Rusia* (a newspaper headline), rough seas continue for Russia.
- 'Okaka. n. A particular company of soldiers belonging to Ka-mehameha.
- 'ō.kā.kai. Same as *hūkākai*, insipid.
- 'ō.kā.kā'i. n. Follower, as in a retinue.
- 'ō.kakala. Redup. of 'ōkala 1, 2. *Pi'i maila ka 'ōkakala*, goose flesh comes.
- 'okaka.lika 'akika, okasalika asida. n. Oxalic acid. Eng.
- 'oka kilika. n. The silky or silver oak (*Grevillea robusta*), a large tree from Australia, used for reforesting in Hawai'i. The leaves are subdivided like some ferns; the orange flowers are abundant in early summer. (Neal 320-1.) *Lit.*, silk oak. Eng. Also *ha'ikū ke'oke'o* and on Ni'ihau, 'oka.
- 'Oka.kopa, Okatopa. n. October. Eng.
- oka kope. n. Coffee grounds.
- 'ō.kala. 1. nvi. Goose flesh, creepy or shuddery sensation; to bristle, stand up, as hair. See ex., 'oehuehu. 2. vs. Rough, coarse, as cloth, shark skin. 3. See *leho 'ōkala*. 4. Same as 'ōkole 2, a sea creature. 5. n. A rather small red seaweed (*Galaxaura rugosa*), regularly and densely branching, the branches hollow and marked with rings; not edible. Also *pākalakala* (*Galaxaura* spp.)
- oka lā. 'au. n. Wood shavings, sawdust.
- 'ō.kala.kala. 1. Redup. of 'ōkala 1, 2; rough, boisterous in manner. See *kani 1*, bristle. 'Ōkalakala kāna pane, his reply was gruff. *Pi'i a'ela kona huhū ā ke po'o 'ōkalakala* (For. 5:409), his anger flashed up to his bristling head. 'Ōkalakala koke a'ela 'o 'Ai-wohi-kupua e hele e māka'ika'i i ka 'aha mokomoko (Laie 383), 'Ai-wohi-kupua bristled with eagerness to visit the boxing arena. 2. vt. To undo evil influence by prayer.
- 'ō.kale.kale. vs. Watery, as inferior poi.
- o kana. See *kana 2*.
- 'okana. n. 1. District or subdistrict, usually comprising several *ahupua'a*; portion, as of food. See 'oki, to cut. 2. Organ. Eng. 'Okana wili lima, hand organ.
- 'oka.naki, oگانadi. n. Organdy. Eng.
- 'oka.nika. vs. Organic (said of the Organic Act). Eng.
- oka.oka. Redup. of *oka*. *Ua nau 'ia ka niu e ka pua'a a okaoka*, the coconut was chewed by the pig into small particles. ho.'ōka.oka. To pulverize, cut into little pieces. (PPN 'ota'ota.)
- 'oka.'oka. n. A bad odor, as of garbage.
- 'oka'o.kai. vs. Insipid, tasteless, especially of freshly pounded poi.
- oka palaoa. n. Chaff. *Lit.*, wheat sediment.
- 'oka pua 'ula.'ula. Same as *kāhili*, *ha'ikū*, gingers. Ni'ihau.
- 'okawa, otava. n. Octave. (MK 7.) Eng.
- 'oke. vs. Rotten, as wood, cloth. Rare.
- ō.keā. 1. n. White sand or gravel (contraction of *one*, sand, and *kea*, white). Cf. *Ke-ōkea*, a place name. *Ōkea pili mai*, drift gravel, said disparagingly of persons who attach themselves to others for support; parasite. *Lit.*, gravel clinging. 2. vs. Hot, as stone heated to whiteness. 3. n. A bird (KL line 432, no data).
- 'ō.ke'a. nv. To place cross sticks, as to block an entrance; cross sticks.
- 'ō.ke'e. vi. To veer, as the wind; to change, as direction; to eddy.
- 'okeke.lika, oseterika. n. Ostrich. Eng. 'Akolika is more common.
- 'okele, okere. n. Ocher. Eng.
- ō.kele.kele. vs. Muddy.
- 'okele.kelika. n. Ostrich. Eng.
- 'ō.keni. Same as *kenikeni*, small change. *Ua loa'a nā wahi 'ōkeni a nā limahana*, the workers received some small change.
- 'oke.'oke. Redup. of 'oke. Rare.
- 'oke.pela, osepera. n. Osprey. (Oihk. 11.13.) Eng.
- 'okepe.laka, oseferaga, osiferaga. n. Vulture (RSV), ossifrage (KJV). (Oihk. 11.13.)
- oki. vi. 1. To stop, finish, end. Cf. *uoki*. *He i'a anei kō ka mākeke? 'A'ole, he oki loa!* Is there fish at the market? No, all gone. *Ua oki nā 'ōlelo a kāua no ka mea ke oki mai nei ka 'ona o ka 'awa ia'u* (Laie 377), our talk stopped because the intoxication of the kava for me became extraordinary. ho.'ōki. To put an end to, terminate, conclude, annul, finish, stop; end. (PPN 'oti.) 2. vs. Extraordinary, wondrous, superlative, much (usually but not always in an unfavorable sense, sometimes with idea: not at all, none, all gone). See ex., *koli-hana, oki 1*. *Oki pau*, extraordinary. *Pehea kou makua kāne? Ua oki loa!* How's your father? Much worse! *Ua hele ke kino ā oki*, his body is wasted [by disease]. *Ua hele 'oe ā oki loa i ka lepo!* You're filthy with dirt! *Kāhiko ā oki a pā'ihiihi*, dressed in best finery, so attractive. *Oki noho'i ka hana a ka Hawai'i 'imi loa*, wondrous indeed are the deeds of deep-seeking Hawai'i. *Oki pau ka hana a ka huila*, wondrous the doings of the wheel. 3. vi. To take effect, as 'awa intoxication. See ex., *oki 1*.
- 'oki. nvt. To cut, especially the hair (see below); to sever, shear, snip, slit, trim, hew, mow, fell, separate, annul, cancel, divorce; to cut, as cards; to operate, amputate; to excommunicate; a cut, division, limit, operation, amputation; stanza (called *paukū* today). 'Oki i nā aumākua, to separate oneself from pagan worship of 'aumākua gods. 'Oki i ka moe'uhane, cancel the dream [end bad effects of a dream by Christian prayer]. 'Oki ā lele ke po'o, behead. 'Oki ka lauoho, to have a haircut. hō.'oki. To pretend to cut short, to cause to cut, cut, divorce, dismiss, cancel, excommunicate. (PPN *koti*.)
- 'okia. 1. Pas/imp. of 'oki. See *kai'okia*. 2. (Cap.) n. Wind name, Hālawā, Moloka'i. (For. 5:103.)
- 'ō.kihi.kihi. vs. Angular, slanting. 'Ōkihikihi nā po'o-hiwi, angular, squared shoulders. 'Ōkihikihi ka ua ke nānā aku (chant), rain appears slanting.
- 'oki huolo. vt. To cut only the ends of the hair. *Lit.*, cut tail.
- 'oki 'ino. vt. To mutilate.
- 'okika. n. Orchid. Eng.
- 'okika hono.hono. n. An orchid (*Dendrobium anos-mum*). (Neal 281-2.)
- 'oki.kene, okigene. n. Oxygen. Eng.
- 'oki kū.mā.kēna. vt. To cut the hair on one side of the head, formerly a sign of mourning.
- 'oki.lipi. n. A variety of sweet potato.
- 'ō.kilo. Same as *kilo*.
- oki loa. See *oki 2*.
- 'oki mahi.ole. vt. To cut the hair leaving a strip down the middle. *Lit.*, helmet cut.
- 'oki male (mare). nvt. Divorce; to divorce. *Lit.*, cut marriage.
- 'oki mau'u. v. To mow the grass. *Mikini 'oki mau'u*, lawn mower.
- 'okina. n. 1. Cutting off, ending, severance, separation. (PPN *kotinga*.) 2. Glottal stop.
- 'oki.'oki. Redup. of 'oki; to cut into pieces, prune, chop, slash, carve. *Pai wela me nā mea 'ai 'oki'oki 'ia*, hot mince pie; *lit.*, hot pie with cut up food. (PPN *kotikoti*.)
- 'oki pahu. vt. To bob the hair. *Lit.*, smooth cut.
- oki pau. See *oki 2*.
- 'oki poe. vt. To bob the hair. *Lit.*, round cut.
- 'oki poe.poe. nvt. Subincision, to subincise; circumcision, to circumcise (a Biblical euphemism, Kin. 17.10; the Hawaiian terms were *kahe ule* and *kaha ule*). *Lit.*, cut roundness.
- 'oki pohe. See *pohe 1*.
