

- olo'ū. vt. To strike, as the forehead. *Rare*.
- 'olouha. vs. Overstuffed with food, an insulting epithet. *Lit.*, sagging intestine.
- olo.wā. n. Space. *Rare*.
- 'olo.wa'a. Var. of *holowa'a*. *Ka 'olowa'a 'auwai o Roma*, the water aqueduct of Rome.
- 'olo.wae. n. Calf of the leg. Also *'olo'olo wawae*.
- olowa.hia. n. *Pūwehe* mat pattern listed by Brigham.
- 'olo.wai. n. Gourd water container.
- olo.walu, oloalu. 1. nvi. Joint action; simultaneous sounds; din of many voices, sounds, as of horns or roosters; to rush or attack in concert; a group, as of hills (*olowalu pu'u*). Cf. *makawalu*, *-walu*. *Olowalu a'ela nā moa*, the cocks crowded. *Ka 'alo 'ana o ke olowalu ihe* (For. 4:269), dodging the onslaught of spears. 2. n. Storehouse, as for chief's property. *Rare*.
- olo.wī. Var. of *ololi*.
- 'olu. nvs. Cool, refreshing; soft, supple, flexible, pliant, elastic, slack, springy; pleasant, comfortable, at ease; polite, kind, courteous; coolness; softness, grace, slackness; comfort, amenities; courtesy, kindness. Cf. *'olu'olu*. *Ka 'olu o ka noho 'ana* (Kep. 97), the amenities of life. *'Olu kona kino i ka hula*, her body is supple in the hula. *hō'olu*. To make soft, limber, pleasant, cool, comfortable; to comfort, please, satisfy, pacify. (PCP *kolu*.)
- 'ō.lū. vs. Soft-shelled, as of a crab (*pāpa'i*) or lobster (*ula*).
- olua. Same as *mana 5*, a fern.
- 'olua. pronoun. You two. *Kō 'olua*, your, yours (of two). (PPN *kimoura*, PNP *koulua*, PEP *kolua*.)
- 'ō.lū.au. Short for *'ao lū'au*.
- 'olu.ēa. nvi. To slacken, ease. *Fig.*, mental relaxation. *hō'olu.ēa*. To slack. *Hō'oluea Mauna Kapu a ha'aha'a, a laila 'oe 'ike i ka nani o Puna* (chant for Ka-umu-ali'i), ease and lower the mount of taboo, then appreciate the beauty of Puna.
- 'Olu-'Eke.loa-ho'o.ka'a-moena. n. Guardian of the sleeping place of the high chief or chiefess (said to be an expert *lua* fighter and of the same sex as the chief or chiefess). *Lit.*, *'Ekeloa* breeze coolness that rolls mats. Cf. *'ohene*.
- 'ō.luhē.luhē. vs. Sagging, drooping, as a potbelly; limp; flabby; soft, as a crab that has shed its shell. *ho'ō.luhē.luhē*. To cause limpness, etc.
- 'ō.lule.lule. Same as *lulelule*. Cf. *hōlule*.
- 'ō.lule.lulea. Pas/imp. of *'ōlulelule*.
- 'ō.lulo. 1. nvs. Castaway; shipwrecked; storm-beset at sea. 2. Similar to *hōlū* and *'ōlū*, soft. 3. n. Gourd container, as for bamboo stamps used for marking tapas. 4. Statue, figure, idol. (And.)
- 'ō.lulo.lulo. Var. of *'ōlulelule*.
- 'ō.lulu. n. A lobelia (*Brighamia insignis*). Also *pū aupaka*. Cf. *ālula* and Neal 816.
- 'ō.lū.lū. nvs. To shake (*lūlū*) with fat; one who so jiggles.
- 'olu'olu. Redup. of *'olu*; pleasant, nice, amiable, satisfied, contented, happy, affable, agreeable, congenial, cordial, gracious; please. *E 'olu'olu 'oe e hele mai*, please come here; *lit.*, be kind to come here. *E 'olu'olu 'oe i ko'u mana'o*, please do me a favor. *'Olu'olu 'ole*, unpleasant, impolite, uncomfortable. *'A'ole o lākou 'olu'olu i 'elua dālā*, they are not satisfied with two dollars. *Mōt 'olu'olu*, gracious majesty. *'Olu'olu nō iāia iho*, satisfied with himself, complacent. *'A'ahu 'olu'olu*, comfortable, casual, informal wear. *Ke noi aku nei au i kou 'olu'olu*, I am asking a favor of you. *E 'olu'olu i ka mea i loa'a*, be satisfied with what you have got. *hō'olu'olu*. Redup. of *hō'olu*; to satisfy, alleviate, allay, console; to retire to rest, to seek rest; parade rest, at ease (military commands). *E hō'olu'olu mai i kō 'oukou mau na'au* (2 Tes. 2.17), comfort your hearts.
- olu.walu. n. Name reported for a minor illness (no data).
- 'ō.lū.palaha. n. Cowrie shell used as an octopus lure.
- oma. 1. vi. To strike with the hands and arms, as in swimming. *Rare*. 2. n. High officer of the chief. *Rare*. 3. n. Variety of *mahimahi*, a fish (no data).
- 'oma. 1. nvt. Oven, baking pan; to roast, bake; roasted. *Fig.*, sacrificial victim. *Pelehū 'oma*, roast turkey. 2. vt. To open the mouth, as though to speak, or as a child about to nurse at the breast; to ask indirectly. *Rare*. 3. n. Female *mahimahi* fish; but cf. *oma 3*. 4. Same as *'o'oma*, concave. *hō'oma*. Same as *ho'o'oma*. *Ko'i hō'oma*, chisel. 5. Small adze. (And.) 6. Space between opposing armies where sacrifices were offered; preparations for war; first men killed in war. (And.)
- 'ō.ma'i. vs. Sickly, weak, ailing, not well.
- 'ō.ma'i.ma'i. Redup. of *'ōma'i*; chronic sickness.
- 'ō.maka. 1. nvi. Budding; beginning; source, as of a stream; to leaf out or bud; to nip off; rising of the sun: See ex., *welo 2*. *'Ōmaka a'ela ka huli*, *'ōmaka pū noho'i ka nahele* (Kep. 153), the taro top leaf out, the plants too leaf out. 2. n. Nipple. *Ka pēpē 'ana o kou mau 'ōmaka* (Ezek. 23.21), the crushing of your breasts. 3. n. Foreskin. (Jer. 4.4.) 4. n. Hilo name for the *makiawa*, herring. 5. n. Belted wrasse fish (*Stethojulis balteata*).
- 'oma.kaha. See *nohu 'omakaha*.
- 'ō.maka.maka. Redup. of *'ōmaka 1*; to leaf out or bud afresh.
- 'Ō.maka-o-ka-t.lio. Same as *Ka-'ōmaka-o-ka-'tlio*.
- 'ō.maka.wai. n. Stream source, headlands.
- 'ō.maka.wai.ū. n. First liquid in the breast before the milk begins to flow.
- 'ō.male. Same as *male*, the young *uhu*, a fish.
- 'ō.male.male. Same as *'ōmale*.
- 'ō.mali. nvs. Weak, infirm, puny, shriveling, wilting, as of unripe fruit; weakling.
- 'omali.ō. nvs. Broad, extended, extensive, flat, as land; a wide athletic field of ancient times. *Rare*.
- 'ō.malu. vs. Cloudy, overcast, shady. *ho'ō.malu*. To cast a heavy shade; overcast.
- 'ō.malu.malu. Redup. of *'ōmalu*. *ho'ō.malu.malu*. Redup. of *ho'ōmalu*.
- 'ō.mamaka. Same as *'ōmakamaka*. *Nā 'ōmamaka kēwai o nā paka ua*, the liquid beginnings of raindrops. *ho'ō.mamaka*. Caus/sim.
- 'oma.male. Same as *'ōmale*.
- 'oma.malu. Redup. of *'ōmalu*.
- 'ō.ma'o. 1. nvs. Green, as plants. 2. n. A bundle wrapped in green leaves, as of ti, for carrying food. *Rare*. 3. n. Hawai'i thrush (*Phaeornis obscurus obscurus*). (PCP *koomako*.) 4. n. Greenish tapa. 5. *Rare* var. of *'ōme'o 2*. 6. (Cap.) n. Star name (no data).
- 'oma'oma. Redup. of *'oma 2*. *hō'oma'oma*. To cause to open the mouth, speak, etc. *Hō'oma'oma i ka waha*, to open the mouth; to work the mouth but not sing with others, to pretend to sing.
- 'ō.ma'o.ma'o. 1. Redup. of *'ōma'o 1*; an emerald (Puk. 28.18). *Ano 'ōma'oma'o*, greenish. *ho'ō.ma'o.ma'o*. To make green, paint green. 2. n. Name of a seaweed.
- 'ō.ma'o.ma'o mae.wale. n. Name of a seaweed. *Lit.*, seaweed that wilts easily.
- 'oma Pukiki. n. Dome-shaped cement or stone outdoor oven, as used by the Portuguese (*Pukiki*) for bread.
- 'ō.mau. 1. nvt. To pin on, fasten (same as *'ōmou*); to gird or bind on, as a sword (Lunk. 3.16); to tuck in, as a sarong; to sew or baste together; a doubling over, tuck. 2. n. Loom (RSV), pining sickness (KJV). (Isa. 38.12.) 3. n. A barbless fishhook. Cf. *mau*, to hold fast. 4. nvi. A brief love affair; to have such an affair. *Rare*.
- 'ō.meā. 1. vs. Reddish; murky. *Ua 'ōmeā 'ia ke kuahiwi* (For. 6:369), the hills are reddish. 2. n. Beloved, respected person. *Ua hehi ka lā iā Hawai'i, he 'ōmeā Pele no Hi'iaka* (prayer), the sun has trod upon Hawai'i, Pele is loved of Hi'iaka. 3. vt. To sun. *E 'ōmeā aku i ka moena*, put the mat in the sun. 4. Same as *'ōuli*. *Rare*.
- 'ō.meā.lani. n. Variety of sweet potato.
- 'ō.meā.meā. Redup. of *'ōmeā 1*.
- 'omeka, omega. n. Omega. (Hoik. 1.8.) *Eng*.
