

- 'omela, omera. n. Omer. (Puk. 16.16.) Eng.
- 'ō.me'o. 1. vi. To bud, to unfold, as a blossom; to come into view; to sprout. Cf. *me'o* 2. 2. Same as *me'o*, nagging.
- 'ō.me'o.me'o. Redup. of 'ōme'o.
- 'omī. vi. To wither, droop; to burn weakly, as a candle. Cf. *hōmī*.
- 'ō.miko. vs. Saline, salty, as soil near the sea. Cf. *miko* 1.
- 'ō.milo. nvt. To twist, turn, curl; to shape, as a canoe hull; to taper, as a baby's fingers by rolling the tips between thumb and index finger; to spin, as thread; to produce abortion, destroy; abortion, foeticide, drill. Cf. *milo* 2.
- 'ō.milo.milo. Redup. of 'ōmilo. Cf. *train* 1.
- 'ō.milu. 1. n. Kind of *ulua*, a fish, probably *Carangoides ferdau*, *C. gymnostethoides*, *C. ajax*. 2. nvs. A trifle, mere nothing; insignificant. 'A'ohe 'ano o ia mea, he 'ōmilu, this thing has no significance, it's a mere trifle.
- 'ō.milu.milu. Same as 'ōmilu.
- 'ō.mī.mī. Redup. of 'omī.
- 'omi.mino. Redup. of 'ōmino.
- 'omimo. vs. Naked, nude. Rare.
- 'ō.mino. vs. Wrinkled, withered, shriveled, stunted; sickly and constantly crying, as an unhealthy child. See ex., 'alalehe.
- 'ō.mīno.mīno. Redup. of 'ōmino.
- 'omī.omī. Redup. of 'omī, to wither.
- 'ō.mio.mio. Same as *olomio*.
- omo. 1. nvt. To suck, absorb; suckling; to gasp (Kep. 116); to evaporate, as water; absorbent; suction tube, rubber nipple. *Keiki omo waiū* (Nah. 11.12), suckling child. 'Ili omo wai, suction tube. ho.'ōmo. Caus/sim.; to draw in, as a wave. (PEP 'omo.) 2. nvi. Sport of leaping from heights into water without a splash; to leap thus. 3. n. Remora, sucking fish. (KL line 155.) 4. n. Gourd, as used for a container. 5. Same as *alaia*, type of surfboard. Rare.
- 'omo. n. Lid, cover, plug, cork, as of a calabash; lamp chimney. (PEP *komo*.)
- omō.hā. n. Tapa design. Cf. *mōhā*, migratory duck.
- 'ō.mohe.mohe. Same as 'ōmolemole.
- 'omo ipu.kukui. n. Lamp chimney.
- omoki. Var. of *omo* 1, 2.
- 'omoki. Var. of 'umoki, stopper.
- omo koko. nv. Bloodsucker, leech; to suck blood.
- 'ō.mole. 1. n. Bottle, jug, jar. 'Ōmole 'aila, cruse of oil. 2. vs. Bare, smooth, hairless.
- 'ō.mole hā.nai wai.ū. n. Nursing bottle.
- 'ō.mole 'ie. n. Jar or bottle bound with rope or wicker, demijohn.
- 'ō.mole waha nui. n. Large-mouthed bottle or jar.
- 'ō.mole.mole. Redup. of 'ōmole 2. *Kukui 'ōmolemole*, a *kukui* nut finished for a lei, but smooth and without design, less choice than the *ioio* or 'ōpaka.
- omo liu. nv. Ship's pump; to suck up bilge.
- omoomo, omomo. Redup. of *omo* 1.
- 'omo.'omo. n. Loaf; any long, oval body, as balls of arrowroot; a mold or molded thing, as adobe bricks. hō.'omo.'omo. To mold, shape. *Hana ihola 'o Kū, 'o Kāne, 'o Lono i ka lepo kele, hō'omo'omo ihola a pa'a* (Kep. 33), Kū, Kāne, Lono made muddy earth, molded it firm.
- 'ō.mo'o.mo'o. 1. Same as 'omo'omo; ridge, crest, as of mountains. 2. n. Bits and pieces, trifles. Cf. *mo'o* 5.
- 'omo.'omo palaoa. n. Loaf of bread.
- 'ō.mo'o.mou. Redup. of 'ōmou.
- 'ō.mou. vt. To pin on, attach, fasten securely, as a brooch. See *pōkē 'ōmou. Kahi 'ōmou*, comb to hold the hair in place or for ornamentation. *Kui 'ōmou*, stick pin, common pin. *Pine 'ōmou*, brooch. *Pua 'ōmou*, corsage. ho.'ō.mou. To cause to pin, to pin, to pretend to pin.
- omo wai.ū. nv. Nipple for a milk bottle; to suck a nipple.
- 'omu. hō.'omu. A calabash for fish. Rare.
- 'omua. n. Whiplash used to throw a *ke'a*, dart, as of *olonā* fiber.
- 'ō.mu'a. Var. of 'ōmu'o.
- 'ō.mu'a.mu'a. Redup. of 'ōmu'a.
- 'ō.mu'e. vs. Bitter.
- 'ō.mu'e.mu'e. Redup. of 'ōmu'e.
- 'ō.muku. nvi. Stump, projection,ommel of a saddle; to project; to cut off short.
- 'ō.mu'o. nvt. Bud, budding; to have buds; to nip off, as a leaf bud; to circumcise; to bring to a point; to be cut off, stopped; sharpened. See *mu'o*, *mu'omu'o*. 'Ōmu'o 'ia a'e ia hana i ka wā kūpono loa, that project was nipped in the bud at the proper time.
- 'ō.mu'o.mu'o. Redup. of 'ōmu'o; tapering off, dying. *Ke ulu 'ōmu'omu'o nei ke kō*, the cane growth is petering out.
- 'ō.mu'u. Var. of 'ōmu'o.
- ona. 1. n. Mite, louse. 2. vt. Infatuated, attracted. Cf. *onaona. Eia mai au 'o Mākalei, lā'au ona mau 'ia e ka i'a*, here am I, Mākalei, wood always attractive to fish. *No ke aha lā e ona 'oe?* (Sol. 5.20). Why should you be infatuated? 3. For *ona* in an idiom, see *ua ona o*, aforementioned. 4. poss. His, hers, its (*o*-form, zero class; Gram. 8.4). (PPN *ho'ona*.) 5. Plural marker preceding the last of two or more things (goods, not people) and usually preceding *mau*. And, and also. *Kalakoia me ona mau lipine*, calico and also ribbons. *Lawe mai i puke, i pepa, a me ona mau peni*, bring books, paper, and also pencils. (Gram. 10.4.)
- 'ona. 1. nvs. Drunk, dizzy and unsteady; intoxicating; intoxication. *Wai 'ona*, intoxicating liquor. *Mea 'ona*, drug, intoxicant, narcotic. hō.'ona. Intoxicating. See more common *hō'ona'ona*. (PPN *kona*.) 2. nvt. Owner, possessor, proprietor; to own. Eng. Cf. 'ona *miliona. E 'ona 'ia ana e a'u*, owned by me.
- 'ō.naha. vs. Bowlegged, bent over, stooped, bent, arched; curved, crescent-shaped, as the moon; pigeon-toed. ho.'ō.naha. To cause to be stooped, bent, bowlegged; to imitate the walk of a bowlegged person.
- 'ō.naha.naha. Redup. of 'ōnaha.
- ō.naha.naha.ia.ua. n. Fertile spot in a lava bed. Rare.
- 'ona.kaka. Same as *nakaka*. (PH 34.)
- 'ona lama. nvs. Drunk on rum or any alcoholic liquor; drunkenness; alcoholic.
- 'ō.nalu.nalu. vs. Somewhat rough, as the sea; to be forming waves of some size.
- 'ona mau. vs. Constantly drunk, alcoholic.
- 'ona mili.ona. n. Millionaire. Lit., owner [of a] million. Eng.
- ona moa. n. Chicken lice or mites.
- 'onana. vs. Weak, awkward, unskilled. Cf. 'nana, *kīnana*.
- onaona. nvs. Softly fragrant; soft fragrance or perfume, aroma; gentle and sweet, as the eyes or disposition; inviting, attractive, alluring, lovely. Cf. *maka onaona, friend. Kole maka onaona*, sweet-eyed *kole* (a fish), [said of a person with alluring eyes]. ho'ō.naona. To impart fragrance; attractive, sweet, alluring. *Ho'ōnaona i ka i'a*, to attract fish, as with the *melomelo*, baited stick. *Ho'ōnaona ho'i nū maka o kēia keiki*, what attractive, sweet eyes this boy has.
- 'ona.'ona. vs. 1. Faint, dizzy, punch-drunk. hō.'ona.'ona. To cause intoxication or dizziness, to feign intoxication or dizziness; intoxicating. 2. Bad-smelling, as stagnant water; unpalatable.
- onaona lā.pana. Same as 'ala aumoe and *kūpaoa*, the night cestrum. Lit., Japan fragrance.
- 'onaulu loa. n. A wave of great length and endurance. (UL 35.)
- 'ona wai.wai. n. Rich person.
- 'ō.nā.wali. Same as 'ōwali, weak.
- 'ona.wali.wali. Redup. of 'ōnāwali.
- 'ona.wele. Same as *nāwele*.
- one. nvs. Sand; sandy; silt; poetic name for land (cf. *one hānau*). *One maka*, wet sand. *Ke one 'ai ali'i o Kākuhihewa*, the chief-destroying sands of Kākuhi-
